

Summer Reading Program for All Ages

Read to Me

Birth to Kindergarten

Children 5 and under who are not yet reading on their own can design their own program this summer with our interactive game cards that help parents build early literacy skills in their child and practice the building blocks of reading (writing, singing, reading, playing). Complete a game card to earn a ticket for the Pool Party.

School Age

Entering grades first through sixth

Children who are reading on their own will complete their own log sheet to earn prizes when they meet their reading goal. Children may either read 5 books from the Children's area (Fiction & Nonfiction) or 10 books from the Preschool and Early Readers Area to earn a ticket for the Pool Party. Reading more than this goal will earn them additional prizes.


Teens

Entering grades seven through twelve

Design your own program this summer by picking up a Bingo card at the Information Desk. Each completed bingo will earn you an entry into the weekly drawing. You'll get a prize when you sign up and after your first bingo you'll receive a ticket to the Pool Party.

Adults

Simply fill out a ticket for each book, magazine, e-book, or audiobook you read. Return the tickets to the Information Desk to be entered into a weekly prize drawing. All tickets will also roll over into the grand prize drawing. This year earn extra tickets and design your own program by completing our challenge bookmarks. Each bookmark has three reading challenges and once you complete all three you will receive an extra entry into the prize drawing.



Family Challenge Program

Up your game by participating in the Family Challenge. To participate simply complete the bingo squares as a family. For each bingo you complete you'll earn an entry into the Family Summer Reading Challenge Drawing. The Family Challenge Drawing will take place at the Pool Party on August 1*. The winning family will receive a family membership of their choice to the Peoria Zoo, Peoria Playhouse, or Peoria Riverfront Museum.


First and third Monday at 9:15 am

Art Quest




Friday, July 21 at 12:30 pm

Super Hero Day - Super Hero Academy


Saturday, June 10 from 10 am - 2 pm

Nature's Architects


Wednesday, June 28 from 3-4 pm


