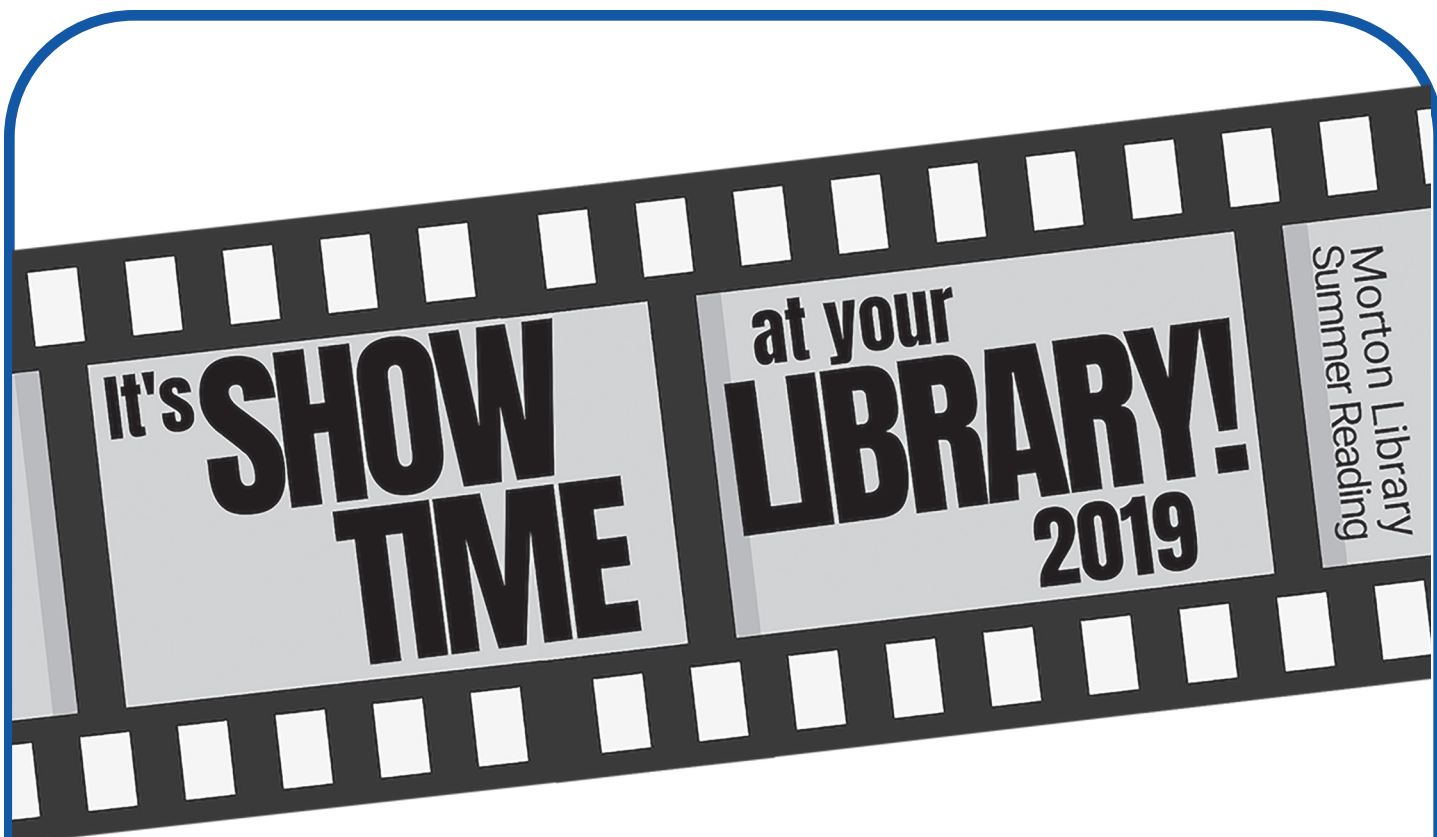

Read to Me

Birth to Kindergarten

Children 5 and under who are not yet reading on their own can participate with their parents. Pick up an activity card and build early literacy skills by practicing the building blocks of reading (writing, singing, reading, playing). Complete an activity card to earn a ticket for the Pool Party. Don't stop at one card - we offer multiple cards for a summer of fun and learning!

School Age

Entering grades first through sixth

School aged children can complete their own log sheet to earn prizes when they meet their reading goal. Children entering grades K through 2 may color in a star for every 10 minutes they read, or are read to, and redeem ten stars for a ticket to the Pool Party. Reading more than this goal will earn them additional prizes. Children entering grades 3-6 may read their choice of books, and can fill a star for every 20 minutes they read, then redeem ten stars to earn their Pool Party ticket.

Teens

Entering grades seven through twelve

Design your own program this summer by picking up a Bingo card at the Information Desk. Each completed bingo will earn you an entry into the weekly drawing as well as a prize. You'll get a prize when you sign up and after your first bingo you'll receive a ticket to the Pool Party.

Adults

For every hour you read or listen fill out a ticket and submit it into our weekly drawing for a gift card. All tickets will roll over into the grand prize drawing. Audiobooks, eBooks, magazines, and reading to your children all count towards your reading time! This year's grand prize will be two season tickets to the Morton Fine Arts Association Fall-Winter Series.

The Very Hungry Caterpillar turns 50!

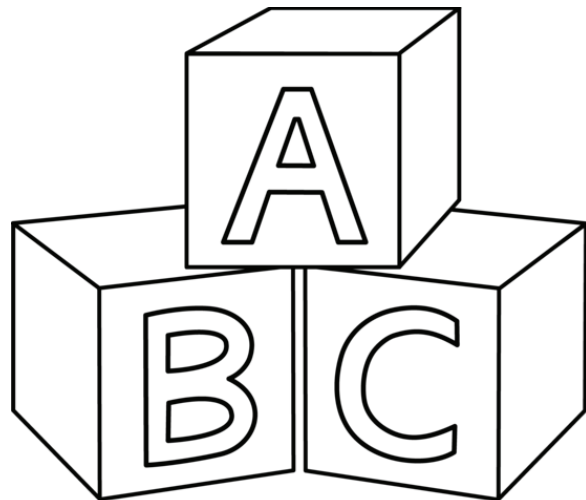
Wednesday, June 5 at 11 am
