It's hard to believe that the Carlisle Ford Nationals has celebrated it's 19th year in 2013 and yet somehow, they continue to add new attractions. This year while visiting the Carlisle Expo Center, attendees could sign up to receive a ride in a new Raptor on the purpose built off road course added to the fairgrounds at the top of the hill. These Raptors were driven by Driving Instructors flown in from Miller Motorsports Park which is located outside of Salt Lake City, Utah. By the time I took my ride on Friday afternoon, the course was very wet and very sloppy. I was very impressed by the handling and performance of the Raptor in the constraints of the course, and that ride may have been worth the price of admission by itself. If you missed it, if they do it again next year and the course is muddy, be sure to go.

Heavily promoted this year was "Early Bird" Thursday adding a fourth day to the weekend. Unfortunately due to the arrival of a tropical storm named Andrea, it was raining by the time we arrived early Thursday afternoon. That storm would linger through Friday damping spirits, parts, cars and canceling the evening's drag racing program.

Out at Building G, the old car dealership, was a display celebrating the 50th anniversary of the 289 small block. Marvin Askin's 67 GT350 and Joe Abbatelli's 64 Fairlane were featured inside along with the 63 Fairlane raced by Special Guest Milo Coleman who was on hand signing autographs and answering questions. Mr. Coleman was the NHRA D/Stock Champion in 1963 and traveled to Carlisle from his home in Oregon.

In Building T, Chris Cella's 67 Mustang SVTGT500 was on display along with the banners and info from this year's Philadelphia Auto Show.

Other guests at Carlisle included Steve Saleen, who spoke and signed autographs in the Saleen Club of America tent, an autograph session and drifting exhibitions with Formula Drift Champion Vaughn Gittin, Jr. out on the Carlisle Autocross track and as part of the 20th Anniversary SVT display, various former and current SVT engineers were in Building Y for autographs and several question and answer sessions.

SJMC at the First State Spring Show





A group of SJMC members made their way to Sheridan Ford in Delaware after breakfast at the Cracker Barrel on June 2nd for the rescheduled First State Mustang and Ford Club Spring Show. The weather was great and everyone had a good time. It was a really nice show with some cool cars and trucks in participation and the dealership is open even though it is Sunday. Once again the South Jersey Mustang Club won the Club Participation Award!

On June 8, the city of Vineland was the place to be for the 22ND Cruise Down Memory Lane (CDML) which attracts anywhere between 900 and over 2,000 American cars and trucks of 1973 vintage or older and between 10-30,000 spectators from the East Coast. Newer models are allowed to participate if their owners belong to a club or their vehicles are highly modified. If you are not familiar with this event you are probably asking yourself where is something this size held? The city of Vineland closes down Landis Avenue, which is the main street ,that covers one mile between East and West Avenues. Cruising Landis Avenue began in the early sixties when this thoroughfare was two lanes in either direction. Many of us from that era would cruise from Friday night to Sunday night or just stand anywhere along the section to watch everyone else cruise in their Mustangs, Mopars, Chevelles, Novas, Galaxies, Fairlanes, Buicks and American Motor products. Cruisers came from the surrounding towns because this was the best location to see and be seen in your car. Sometimes there was a stop light to stop races or cruisers would depart the avenue to locations where they could race each other to see who had the fastest cars. Many long lasting relationships both as friends and some romantic were as a result of meeting on this one mile strip.

This year's CDML, as last year's cruise, was Co-coordinated by the South Jersey Cruisers led by Ben Notaro and our South Jersey Mustang Club with yours truly as the other coordinator. The weather reduced this year's participation by about 45% of last years record breaking 2000+ vehicles after approximately 500 were turned away. Barry Gruccio and his crew were in charge of setting up the barricades to prevent unauthorized traffic from entering the cruise area. Dennis Dase and crew manned the gate at West Avenue and Joel Webster of Cumberland County Fire Police and his crew managed the East Avenue gate. Thanks to both clubs' members and other volunteers, the staging areas located at the West end, Cunningham School and Sacred Heart lots were well organized and by 5:00 PM the western side of Landis had a majority of the cars parked on both sides. Claudia & Lewin Mitchell, Diane & Bill Pearson, Nancy & Victor Nordberg, Terri Smith and Bill Kalwhite, along with his Christian Motorcycle Club did a stupendous job of organizing the individual clubs and handing them cruise rule information. Last year this lot was overwhelming but this year our club members did a remarkable job. John Wolfe was in charge of Cunningham School and with the help of Rich Iglesia and other club members, the lot was well organized in preparation for the participants entrance onto the east side of Landis Avenue. Club member Ben Light was in charge of the Sacred Heart lot. The Boulevard to East Avenue was late in having cars parked due to a funeral and a wedding being held on that side and the green light to park the cruisers came after 4:00 PM. Joe and Joanna Volpe, Kelly Sainson and Cole Sammartino helped with the parking on the east side along with the Nordbergs. By 5:30 the avenue was practically full thanks to the mentioned and unmentioned with a special thanks going to the Cumberland County Fire Police and the Vineland Police. From East to West Avenues all you could see was a "Sea of People" in the middle checking out the cars parked on each side of the avenue. When the cruise began after 8:30 I had the pleasure of being driven by Vineland Police Officers Chip and subsequently Heather in Vineland's 1966 Ford Galaxie Police car while Ben rode in a new Charger Police car. The spectators kept requesting burnouts but the officers obeyed the rules and enjoyed cruising from east to west and back again. I listened to the police on the radio doing their job for every ones' safety by identifying and evicting those cruisers that were doing burnouts.

In all, this was another good cruise and Ben Notaro's last CDML and I will miss working with my friend and dual club member but his legacy, as one of the founding persons of the cruise, will continue on per his vision of 22 years ago.
