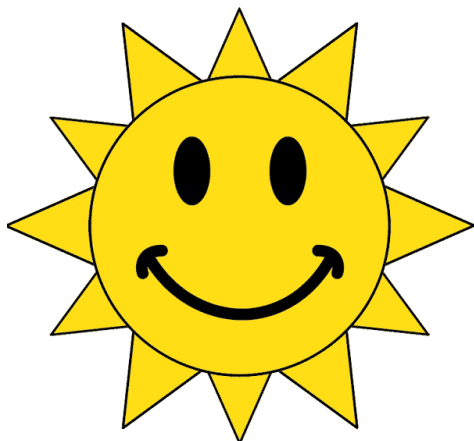

Joe was a loving Husband, Father, Grandfather and Great Grandfather to his Family and a valued member in several Organizations. Joe will be missed by all who knew him.

On April 1st, I attended the opening Press Day of the New York Auto Show at the Jacob Javits Convention Center. Many of you have attended the auto show in Philly; this show is much more impressive. There are many new car introductions at this, the last big show of the season. Even though Ford had no formal press conference this year, they featured the US introduction of the Focus RS. The RS line had been the hot Fords in Europe for many years and many in the US wanted it available here. The new Focus RS has All Wheel Drive with a 2.3L EcoBoost 4 with over 315 HP; it should be a rocket. Performance was the theme in the Ford display with the new Shelby GT350R, Ford GT, Raptor, Focus ST & Fiesta ST being shown. The GT350R, the Raptor & 2 STs were in the same non-production Liquid Blue color as when they were revealed in Detroit. The Ford GT was Liquid Silver with grey stripes and the Focus RS was in a stunning production light blue metallic color called Nitrous Blue. There was also a new Mustang GT on its side so you could see the new IRS and other features from a different viewpoint.

Even though Ford didn't have a press conference, it was a different story at Lincoln. Mark Fields, CEO of Ford, presented the Lincoln Continental Concept. Along with the car itself, a new theme for Lincoln was introduced; Quiet Luxury. The Continental also revealed the new design DNA for future Lincolns. The car attracted a lot attention and was a real looker.

It was an exhausting day of press conferences, reveals and displays but well worth it and not an April Fools Joke was to be found.

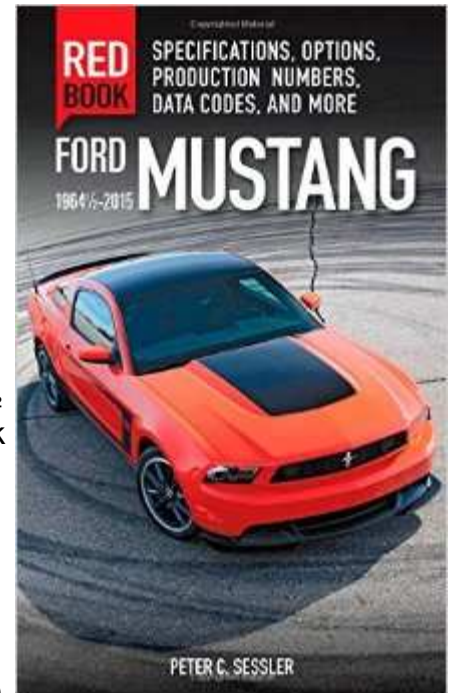


The Mustang Red Book Review

Last month I received a request from Nichole Schiele Marketing Manager, for the Ford Mustang Red Book: 1964 ½ - 2015 written by Peter C. Sessler. She asked me would I be willing to accept a copy of the book to review and let our club members know my thoughts. I agreed and received the book yesterday. All I can say is WOW! This book contains the complete data on over 50 years of the Mustang from the first six-cylindrical Mustang of 1964 ½ through the Boss and Shelby models to the all-new 2015 Mustang! This book contains specifications, options, production numbers, data codes and much more. This is an ideal book for current owners, restorers or anyone who is thinking about purchasing a Mustang or parts of any year. It is a go to reference guide regarding production figures and totals, serial number decoding, locations, Ford Vin decoding, engine codes, carburetors, distributors, prices, exterior colors and interior trim codes and selected facts. From 2000-2015 it provides the retail price of each year and many of the options. For example it lists that 134,082 Mustangs were produced in 2014 of them 908 were Shelby convertibles which I wanted to know. They list the retail codes and costs of the various packages like Code 975-50 Years Appearance Package \$1,595 and its contents. This is a one stop information resource for those of you thinking about purchasing a new Mustang for negotiation since they are retail prices. It is a super guide for restoration or repair of your older Mustangs. Last year I needed a front float fuel bowl for the 715 Holley on my 1967 Shelby. However had I had this book it would have saved me research time since this book lists the carburetor specs for both the 1967 GT350 4-speed: Holley R-3259 715 cfm and the Automatic: Auto-lite 460 cfm.

This is a must have book for the Mustang enthusiast, owner, future owner, collector, show judges, etc. The book retails for \$24.95 but the good news is that the club will be able to purchase them at a substantial discount as long as ordered and paid for by one person i.e our club.
