A while back you may have received an email informing you of a screening of the movie "A Faster Horse" at Franklin Mills in Philadelphia. While I was interested, it would have been difficult for me to attend. Thanks to the efforts of Helaina and Ron Semmler thru TUGG and enough tickets presold, a screening was held on Thursday evening October 15th in Cherry Hill at the AMC 24, the only screening in New Jersey. The audience consisted of mainly members from the Garden State and South Jersey Mustang Clubs, the 2 MCA clubs in New Jersey.

The movie is a documentary on the history of the development of the first Mustang as well as the current model that debuted in 2015. A brief history of Ford Motor Company as well as the Ford Family helps to bring the early years of Mustang into perspective. The film makers were able to interview key people that worked on Mustang through its 50 year history. Team Mustang Project Lead Engineer Dave Pericak is followed from 2009 to 50th Anniversary Celebration in Charlotte as he and his team develop and refine the new for 2015 Mustang.

I would recommend this film for any Mustang Enthusiast, but I think any auto enthusiast would find this film informative and educational as well as entertaining. It is currently available On Demand from Comcast for rental.

Although I am a little late, after a ten year hiatus Hallmark has reissued their Kiddie Car Classic line and yes as you may have already guessed, one of them was a limited edition Blue Mustang with white details. Limited to 6000 pieces, like the cars before them they are very nicely detailed for their size. Along with them they also reissued the



smaller tree ornament to coincide with the bigger car. Now along with the blue one, just in time for Christmas they have released a 4800 piece repaint in Kelly Green with gold over the top stripes and gold rocker panel stripes. I guess they couldn't get the rights to use the GT350H, which would have been cool. While I am still on the subject of Hallmark, during their December 4-6 Gift of Memories Weekend, they will be releasing an Orange 2015 Mustang GT Ornament, while there if you're a Mercury fan you may want to look for the 1970 Cougar Eliminator in Orange and Black, this is the 25<sup>th</sup> in the Classic American Muscle car series.

Now for you Hot wheels collectors, I have found a bunch of Mustangs lately. It may take a few trips to Kmart, Walmart and Target but I have seen most of these Mustangs that I am listing in these stores. First we have a 1965 Mustang 2+2 fastback in gray with teal stripes and chrome wheels and in blue with yellow stripes and wheels, a 1968 Shelby in yellow with black stripes and a orange Boss 302 with black stripes. I have found three different variations of the custom 2012 Ford Mustang with the Falken tires, livery,silver and blue, blue and green and black and white. I also found a Ford Mustang GT concept black Sheriff's car with light bar on the roof. Last but not least, I have found 2 2015 Mustang GT's, one is gunmetal gray with teal stripes and the other is blue with yellow stripes. Finally I found a custom 2015 Ford Mustang race car in red with black stripes, rear wing, raised hood scoop and front splitter. With all the Mustangs I have found, this should keep everyone busy this Holiday Season.
