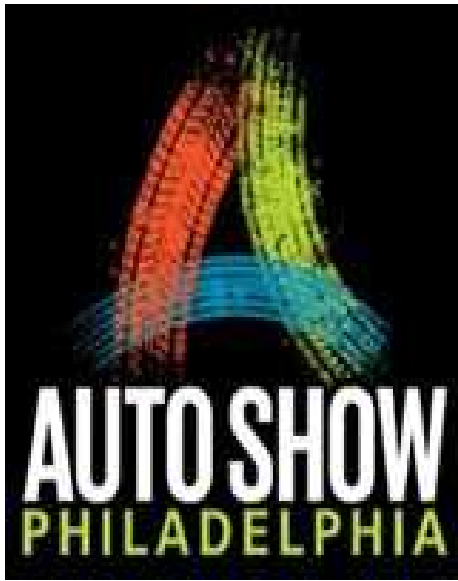
One special day a year, the Mustang world unites by taking their Mustangs to the road!

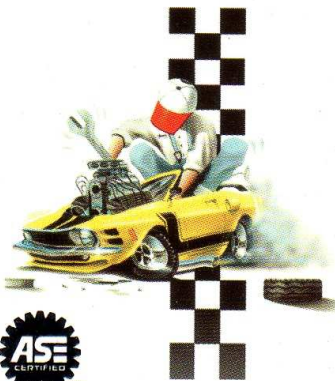

My Mustang.....Herb Sharp



Each of us has a story to tell about our Mustang, here's mine.....

Back in 1998 I decided the time was right to purchase another Mustang. The 35th Anniversary Mustang Show was coming in April 99 and I wanted to do more than be a spectator. I decided on a SN95 Cobra and began looking for one. Months went by with no luck. A week before I was to go to Charlotte for the 35th Show on my way home from work, I spot a white Mustang at Cherry Hill Imports. I didn't get a good look, could it be a Cobra? I turned around and went back to see. Yes, it was a 1996 Cobra that was traded in for a Porsche Boxster. I talked with a salesman, took it for a test drive and made a deal to purchase. Now I had to go home and tell Laura what I had done.

I picked the car up the morning I was leaving to go to Charlotte for the 35th. I hadn't driven a stick shift in over 10 years and never had a 5 speed. I'm going to Charlotte in a used manual transmission car I just bought. Good thing I'm traveling with friends. We made it to Charlotte and back with no problems.

Since then, we've been to the 40th in Nashville, the 45th in Birmingham and returned to Charlotte for the 50th. We've also been to SAAC 25, 33 and 40. We've been to Michigan to attend the SVT Experience in 2000 and returned in 2003 for Ford's 100th Anniversary Celebration.

I have driven my Cobra on the Ford test track in Michigan, both tracks in Millville, Charlotte Motor Speedway, Pocono Raceway, Lime Rock in addition to several SVT On Track events at Summit Point, West Virginia. We've been down the track at Atco Raceway and Raceway Park in Englishtown. Later this year, we're going to Indianapolis and drive the Brickyard at the MCA 40th Anniversary Celebration. I have visited more states in my Cobra then all the other vehicles I have driven combined.

Like most Mustang owners, I've made a few mods. I have installed sequential taillights, a Pro 5.0 shifter and lowering springs. The rear wheels are widened to allow the fit of 275-40 BFGs. I had 4.10 gears installed which made the Cobra much more fun to drive. When I had the steering wheel recovered, I had a thicker pad installed.

There were times when I considered selling my Cobra and buying a late model Shelby GT500 or a Boss 302, but I've come to think that my Cobra is a part of the family. I have so many more good memories with this Mustang than with any other vehicle I have driven, that's probably why it's still in my garage.

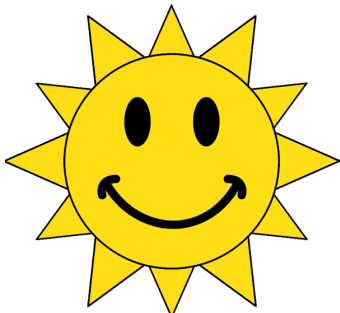
