

It's been a difficult journey to this point. First, finding a fair deal, which is not easy given the limited production. Then, choosing a color combination. These things seem to look great no matter what color you choose! Then, choosing another color combination because I just couldn't decide. Wait, maybe Blue with White Strips? Yes, that's it!!!

I placed my order with Mullinax Ford in New Smyrna Beach, Florida, on January 16th. Yes, Florida!!! These guys were great to deal with and offered me a fair deal considering the current market conditions. I drove my salesman crazy with all the changes, starting at first with White/Blue Stripes, then Red/White Stripes, finally settling on Blue/White Stripes. Wow, ok, got that last change in just in time!!! It was official, a New Shelby GT350 Track Pack, Deep Impact Blue with White Stripes. Now the seemingly endless wait to production and delivery......

After a painful month of waiting, I finally got a VIN from Ford on February 17th! I can't tell you how excited I was!!! It truly feels real when you get a VIN. Build date was set for March 7th. I thought I would play it cool and not call Ford Performance for an update until maybe the 8th or 9th, yeah right! I called Monday the 7th to find it had already gone through the body shop on Saturday and was heading to trim! By Friday it had passed inspections and was on a rail car!

The folks on Mustang6G.com deserve a special thanks. These guys know all the ins and outs of ordering and tracking a Shelby. I had guys helping with production tracking and rail tracking. I basically followed my car from the body shop to the production line and finally on the railroad to my dealership. It was exciting, frustrating, and fulfilling all at the same time.

My car arrived at the dealer on March 22nd. The dealership was great and did everything I asked, which was essentially nothing! I didn't want the car touched until I could get there. It had arrived with 3 miles on the odometer (confirmed with photos from my salesman). I was to fly down and pick it up the following Tuesday. I couldn't wait, and barely got any sleep the entire week. Upon arrival, I took pictures of every sticker, label and tag. When I was done, the detail guys did a great job carefully removing each sticker and saving them for me. Then the moment it all becomes real... push in the clutch and press the START button! The 5.2 liter Flat Plane Crank comes to life. The burble of 526 Horsepower sits idle waiting for a command. But wait, there's more. Engage Sport Mode and it gets ANGRY!!! The Active Exhaust opens up and confirms this is a different beast. The sound is intoxicating. Before we knew it, we were heading North in a new Shelby! What a great car and a wonderful trip!!!

We spent Easter week in Punta Gorda, Florida with family and I was able to attend two car shows and visit two auto museums. The second day I was there, the Muscle Car Museum in Punta Gorda sponsored a car show in it's parking lot. There were over 220 cars of all makes and models including Rat Rods and Dune Buggies. The 1960 Lincoln in attendance was two feet longer than a standard parking space.

Two days later I visited the Muscle Car Museum housed in an old Wal-Mart. The museum has over 150 GM cars, all cars are registered and run, though there are no Fords on display, the collection would appeal to any car nut. They also sell cars on consignment, there was a primo 69 MACH 1 WITH a Cobra Jet but the \$70,000 price tag was out of my range.

Two days later I took a three hour trip to Ocala to visit the Don Garlits Drag Racing Museum. The museum is housed in two buildings, one dedicated to classic cars and the other to dragsters. He has the 1964 Mustang he received as a prize for winning the 1964 NHRA Nationals and also every Swamp Rat he ran on diplay in the museum. It was my lucky day because Don was conducting a private tour. I joined about fifteen other car guys to tour his two shops and private collections, among the highlights was his starting a front engine rail and demonstrating a series of flat head Ford engines in various states of tune.


