THE END OF THE V6

While not yet confirmed by Ford, there seems to be strong evidence that they will be ending production of the V6 Mustang. On a list of dealer options, the V6 and V6 convertible body style options were missing from the drop down menu while the EcoBoost, GT and GT350 options were all present. Since the release of the EcoBoost Mustang, enthusiasts have been speculating that the end of the V6 Mustang's production was near, but it looks like 2018 will finally be the year.

THE 10-SPEED AUTO TRANSMISSION

The 2018 Mustang will be receiving a 10-speed automatic transmission, like the one that is in the 2017 SVT Raptor. With a focus on improving fuel economy, the new 10-speed automatic will likely be replacing the beloved 6R80 6-speed that Ford has been using since 2011, however that has yet to be confirmed.

QUAD ACTIVE EXHAUST

A new feature that has been spotted across numerous test mules has been a quad active exhaust setup like the one on the Shelby GT350. With four exhaust tips, quad active exhausts use a button to activate a butterfly valve that will either make your Mustang louder or quieter. NO word if this option will be available on EcoBoost Mustangs however this is sure to be a bit hit and selling point for 2018 Mustang GTs.

GT350 SUSPENSION

You will be able to get a 2018 Mustang with Magneride Dampers, just like the ones you'd find on a Shelby GT350. For a quick oversimplification of what Magneride is, basically the dampers use a magnetic fluid to control how stiff/soft the dampers are with a magnetic current dictating how the fluid reacts. This should further boost the already potent performance of the S550 Mustang's IRS system.

STYLING CHANGES

The 2018 Mustang looks like it will be getting a less pronounced hood than what was offered on 2015 models; test mules have been spotted using a hood with a 1" lowered hood line. While there are other minor bodyline changes, the biggest additions to the S550's styling come from the addition of "Orange Fury," "Royal Crimson," and "Lead Foot Gray" paint colors. The 2018 Mustang is also doing away with the short-lived "Grabber Blue" color.

UPGRADED POWER & PERFORMANCE

Multiple test vehicles have been spotted with a strange bump coming out of the hood, leading many to believe that Ford is tweaking and updating the 5.0L engine, possibly with direct injection. The Blue Oval has been pretty tight lipped about what power changes may be coming to the Mustang, however it appears they are adding another Performance Package option to the lineup, but there has been no word yet on how it will differ from the original package.
