The Benevolence committee met after church May 17th and discussed the needs of our community and of the world. Because of our congregation's faithful sharing of God's blessings our church willingly and joyfully is able to reach out to those in need.



Nepal was at the top of our list and unanimously we agreed to send the PDA (Presbyterian Disaster Assistance) \$3000. 00 earmarked for water provisions. Also, internationally, we agreed to continue support of Doctors Without Borders in the sum of \$1000.00 to support their work world-wide. Locally we continue support of the Body of Christ and their building of a new dental clinic for those in need in Bell County.
