Carl's Comments - Reverend Carl Thompson

"Time is filled with swift transition, Naught of earth unmoved can stand, Build your hopes on things eternal, Hold to God's unchanging hand. Refrain: Hold to God's unchanging hand, Hold to God's unchanging hand; Build your hopes on things eternal, Hold to God's unchanging hand."



Bare with me today as I do some personal reflection. Last month I wrote to you about the importance of building our hope on things eternal and holding on to God's unchanging hand. I wrote this because of three tragedies that had recently struck the Salado community: a drowning, a fall, and a car accident that all lead to a death. I wrote this to remind us all that time is filled with swift transitions, tomorrow is not promised to us, so we need to hold tight to God's unchanging hand.

Who would have known that a few days after that writing my family would be going through transitions? My mother would be diagnosed while in the emergency room with having several strokes and be in the midst of having a heart attack. After eight days in the hospital she was released to a rehabilitation center where she would be learning to use her legs again and working on regaining memory and communication skills at the age of eighty-nine.

At the same time, school was about to start and our son Michael and his wife Kelly would both be working again. Evelyn and I took on the responsibility of watching our soon to be one year old granddaughter. We wanted to do that even though they could afford to send her to daycare. We want to be a part of her early formative years.

Recently, we were able to see Libby go from crawling, to taking little steps, to walking everywhere around the house. She is now trying to communicate by using those little one or two syllable words like dada or momma. Everything around her excites her as she points to it and makes funny little noises. I wonder what she is thinking and trying to say as a one year old.

An eighty-nine and a one year old, two extremes, two separated generations going through the same learning processes of life, learning to walk and communicate. Time is filled with swift transition -- how will we deal with it. I wonder who will be important in my granddaughter's life? Who will help her learn to build her hope on things eternal and hold on to God's unchanging hand?

What school teachers, Sunday school teachers, pastors, congregations, neighbors and friends will be a witness to God's love for her? She is like a blank canvas waiting to

be getting more tests in Oct.



This past Sunday, representatives from Families-In-Crisis and the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program visited our church and explained how each agency works and described the needs of their clients.


