Building and Grounds - Chine Ray The Session recently approved two significant pro-

jects which fall under the responsibility of the Building and Grounds Committee. <u>First</u>, the building of a privacy fence along the West property line. The fence will establish a very visible and attractive property boundary marker as well as adding aesthetically to our property. Before the contractor could begin work, the



property line had to cleared of years of neglected tree and shrub overgrowth. This was accomplished over several days by an, *always willing to help*, group of volunteers. Especially helpful in the completion of this task, was the use of Jim Ervy Sr.'s tractor, truck and trailer. Other volunteers: Bill Pinkston, John Pettijohn, Jerry Schleicher and J. R. Lett. By the middle of April, members and guests will see a 325ft. cedar privacy fence along the West property line. The fence will be 6ft. high with steel posts supporting every 7' 10". Provisions have been made to install a gate midway in the fence to allow our Episcopalian friends passage to our property.

<u>The other project</u> approved by the Session is the installation of security lighting for our property focusing on the parking lot and other exterior areas. The Session's primary concern in approving this project was the safety and security of members after dark. This project is part and parcel to a broader security policy soon to be implemented on behalf of the congregation. That policy includes reevaluating our phone and communication status, lock and key control, gun policy, and activity monitors before, during and after services. During this period of reevaluation and study, member input is highly encouraged.

Things Jesus Did After His Resurrection - Worship (Walt Tindell)

After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. Acts 1:3.

We see three things that Jesus did during that time.

Jesus restored His disciples' faith & gave them hope.

Jesus' crucifixion devastated His followers. In Matthew 19:27 Peter said to Jesus, "We have left everything to follow you." And in John 6:68 he said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." In John 20:9 we also learn that they "did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead."

From the viewpoint of His followers, while Jesus was being crucified, everything they had hoped in and believed in was dying before their eyes.

So after His resurrection Jesus set out to restore their hope.

We see Him appear to a sobbing Mary Magdalene in John 20:15-18. With one simple word, "Mary", Jesus restored her faith and gave her hope.



Then in John 20:19-30 Jesus appeared to the apostles and "showed them his hands and side", which had been pierced for their sin. Then we're told the apostles were "overjoyed when they saw the Lord."

They had misunderstood. What the world had meant for evil, God meant for good.

Jesus taught His disciples how the scriptures pointed towards Him.

As we saw earlier Jesus' followers did not understand what the Scripture said about Him. That's why once their faith was restored Jesus moved to ground their faith through Scripture.

In Acts 1:2-3 where we find Jesus giving the apostles commandments and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God.

In Luke 24:27 we see Jesus, beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, explaining to His disciples what was said in the Scriptures concerning himself.

And still in Luke 24:32 where the disciples' "hearts burned" as Jesus "opened the Scripture" to them. They once were blind to the truth of the Bible but Jesus gave them spiritual sight.

Jesus sent His followers out to share the good news.

With their faith restored and strengthened, Jesus' final instructions to the Apostles in Matthew 28:19 was to "go and make disciples of all nations" by sharing with the world the great things that Jesus has done.

What does this mean to me today?

- We have all the proof we need that God's plan will work out as the Bible shows. So don't worry.
- Live in faith, trusting the invisible God to do as He has said.
