
It was a very scary situation for everybody, and very embarrassing for the Millers. They feel bad that the church service was stopped..

Mother's Day - from Walt Tindell

Anna M. Jarvis first suggested the national observance of an annual day honoring all mothers because she had loved her own mother so dearly. At a memorial service for her mother on May 10, 1908, Miss Jarvis gave a carnation (her mother's favorite flower) to each person who attended. Within the next

few years, the idea of a day to honor mothers gained popularity, and Mother's Day was observed in a number of large cities in the U.S. On May 9, 1914, by an act of Congress, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. He established the day as a time for "public expression of our love



and reverence for the mothers of our country."

Mother's Day is a very special day. It is a day when we remember our mothers. We give her gifts and phone calls. I heard about a wealthy son who decided to do something special for his mother on her day. He went to a pet shop and saw a very expensive talking bird. This was an unusual bird. This bird could whistle Amazing Grace. This bird could quote the 23rd Psalm. It was an unusual bird. The cost of the bird was \$30,000. But what did he care. He was wealthy so he spent the \$30,000 and bought the bird for his mother and had it shipped to her. On Mother's Day he made his call to his mother. "Mother, how did you like the bird I sent you?" She said, "O, it was delicious, son." I don't suppose any of you sons will get into that dilemma but it is a day when we send our mothers something very, very special.

May 8th is Mother's Day, so I thought you'd enjoy this list of things my mother taught my brother and me:

Adult Education


We will continue the DVD Series on Mere Christianity by C. S. Lewis through Sunday May 22. This will conclude our studies for this spring.



Session Report on Church Security - Building & Grounds (Chine Ray)

For a number of weeks now, the Session has been considering the need and specifics of a Security Policy for the Church. The Building and Grounds Committee reported in last month's Newsletter that some aspects of the Policy had already been implemented or installed, such as the expanded phone system, a policy decision on prohibiting open carry of guns on church property, and installation of upgraded exterior

security lighting. Additionally, an upgrade in building exit signage will be forthcoming shortly as well as emergency lighting for the sanctuary, the kitchen, and the narthex.

Another area of concern has to do with security of the building itself. It is general knowledge among the congregation that many members have keys to the building. This makes sense, given the significant

number of members who have responsibilities which necessitate having access to the building at times other than when Carl is onsite. On numerous occasions, the building has been found unsecure because someone did not lock a door behind them upon their departure. Presently, this committee is considering the installation of a locking mechanism that will lock automatically after either entry or exit. Also, anyone who

presently requires access at unusual times will be asked to sign for a key. Once a new locking system is installed the congregation will be advised.

The most discerning aspect of developing a security policy revolved around whether to

hire an armed/uniformed law enforcement officer during scheduled services to provide a visible and active defense against any actual or perceived threat to the congregation, such as an active shooter. After much discussion, prayer and member input, the session decided that the presence of a uniformed law enforcement officer would offend the religious dignity of worship and otherwise be an uncomfortable environment for many folks. Consequently, the session will

implement an internal security concept whereby members will be asked to monitor the premises immediately before, during and after regular services. Monitors will be asked to immediately report any security infractions noted and make recommendations for improving the security posture of the church. A training plan for security monitors is presently being developed and will be in place shortly.




Finance Committee - Carl Menyhert


