## THE ANGELS OF CHRISTMAS

In Biblical times, it wasn't unusual for men and women to be visited by angels; and they always had a message to deliver. It was usually prefaced with these words: "Fear not".



The angels of Christmas had a very important message to deliver, without a doubt, the most important message ever delivered to anyone.

Who were these angels of Christmas?

The angel Gabriel appeared to Zachariah to announce the birth of John the Baptist, who would "prepare the way of the Lord".

Gabriel also appeared to Mary and announced that she had been chosen by God to fulfill the prophesy of Isaiah, and give birth to the holy child, the longawaited redeemer of Israel.

An angel, not named, appeared to Joseph, to confirm the validity of Mary's claims, and to assure Joseph that he should continue with his plans to take Mary as his wife.

After Jesus' birth, an angel again appeared to Joseph to warn him of Herod's intention to kill the holy child; and to tell Joseph to flee to Egypt with Mary and the baby.

#### \* Congregational Meeting Nov. 13

Two elders were elected at the Congregational Meeting. Nancy Norris and Joyce Goza were elected to three-year terms as elders of the Class of 2019. Nancy joined in 2012. Joyce joined the church in 2014.



The newly-elected elders are scheduled to be ordained at the Jan. 8, 2017 worship service. They will take on the Worship Committee responsibilities. Please continue to keep members of the Session and its work in your prayers.

The 1917 Budget was presented.

#### \* Session Meeting Nov. 6

Mike Moore presented a draft budget for 2017. The Church is doing well financially, meeting all financial obligations to Presbytery and 25% toward Benevolences. Mike will serve as Treasurer one more year with the replacement to start training in July.

Nancy's 8 member committee operates on the guideline of 60% of disbursements to local entities, 40% to world-wide agencies, with annual outgo 25% of total Church income. They continue to use a strong charity vetting process to ensure our benevolence dollars are used primarily for their recipients.

Carl Menyhert checked and Presbytery has received the signed 1917 contract for Pastor Carl. The Congregation will vote on the nominating committee in January. Current members for consideration are Ellen Staples and Jerry Schleicher. Additional nominations will be taken from the congregation.

A motion by Sara Pettijohn was made and passed for the following Session Dates in 2017: Jan.15, April 30, July 16, October 15 plus the Annual Congregational Meeting Jan. 29.
