The Loss of Michael Kelsey

Michael Wayne Kelsey, age 66 of Belton died Monday, March 27, 2017 at his residence. He was born on August 16, 1950 in Temple to Leo and Virginia Dorene (Cunningham) Kelsey. While his father was stationed on the border of South Carolina / Georgia he completed his college degree. He worked in the appliance business in Temple before joining the Temple Public Library. He was in the Reference and Genealogy Department for 18 years before retiring in 2012.

Michael married Nancy Graff on May 23, 1997 in Temple. They have attended the Presbyterian Church of Salado for several years. Only his illness kept them from joining.

Michael and Nancy have written 15 books in the History and Genealogy categories. Their current work is a book concerning the History of Salado and E.S.C. Robertson of Salado.

He was also a member of the Sons of the Confederate Veterans, the Bell County Historical Commission, the Salado Historical Society, the Bell County Genealogical Society, and the Historic Temple Landmark Committee. He also had the honor of being a member of Belton Police Department's CHIPS (Citizens Helping in Police Service) program.

He is preceded in death by his father Leo Kelsey.

He will be greatly missed by his wife Nancy Kelsey of Belton, his mother Virginia Kelsey of Temple, his sister Donna

Gott of Belton, his brother Terry Kelsey of Temple, his step-daughters Ginny Parsons of Virginia and Tina Schreiber of Idaho: his nieces Jackie Blankenship, Nichole Morrow and nephews Keith and Brandon Gott, plus his favorite grand niece Scarlett Gott.

Visitation will be held from 6-8:00PM on Wednesday, March 29, 2017 at Hewett-Arney Funeral Home. Memorial services will be held at 3 PM on Thursday, March 30, 2017 at the Presbyterian Church of Salado. Burial will be at 1:00PM on Friday, March 31 at Oakwood Cemetery in Cisco, TX.


Benevolence Giving



Recipe of the Month from Carol Shuck

LOADED CAULIFLOWER

- 1 large head of Cauliflower cut into bite size pieces (approximately 6 cups)
- 6 8 strips of bacon cooked and crumbled (Cooked in oven at 400° for 20 mins)
- 6 tablespoons chopped Chives
- 1/2 cup Mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup Sour Cream
- 2 cups Colby Jack Cheese (may use cheddar)
- 8 ounce container of sliced mushroom (optional)



Preheat oven to 425°

In a large pot boil water and cook Cauliflower for 8 - 10 minutes, drain and let cool. Don't need to over-cook this.

In a large bowl combine sour cream, mayo, 1/2 of crumbled bacon, 3 tbs chives, 1 cups of cheese, mushrooms (optional) and cauliflower and mix well.

Place in baking dish and cover with remaining 1 cup of cheese and rest of bacon crumbles. Bake for 15-20 minutes until cheese is melted. Top with remaining 3 tbs chives and serve.
