"The Twelve"

"For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called". (1 Corinthians 1:26)

These are the names of "the twelve:" Simon, whose name Jesus changed to Peter; Andrew, his brother; James and John, the sons of Zebedee; Philip and Bartholomew; Matthew and Thomas; James the son of Alphaeus; Simon, called the Zealot; Judas the son of James; and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed the Lord.

You will find them listed by name in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and the book of Acts, not necessarily in that order. However, Peter is always listed first.

"And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church". (Matthew 16:18). There was one political activist, thus the name Zealot, a tax collector, and some fishermen. As for the rest, I don't recall ever reading what their professions were.

They weren't doctors or lawyers. There wasn't a religious leader in the bunch. They were common men; and yet, they were chosen.

They were called disciples (students), and later apostles (messengers). And they were hand picked by Jesus, to spread the gospel.

Through God's wisdom, they were chosen. They believed in Jesus Christ and accepted the call of the Holy Spirit; and became the foundation of the church-the church which more than two thousand years later still stands. God doesn't make mistakes. God can take "ordinary" men and turn them into "extraordinary" men.
