The goal of this event is to enable burn survivors and their families to use the connections they have made to help them deal with daily issues that arise from living with a burn injury. It is a time for sharing information, learning new ideas, discussing challenges and having fun.

Guest Speaker

Kimberly was in Grade 12. While attending a family dinner party, she endured a severe burn injury that irrevocably changed her life forever as well as ending the life of her boyfriend. Miraculously, she went on to graduate from high school as well as college. She is a wife, mother, officer manager and a certified SOAR (survivors offering assistance in recovery) volunteer at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle. She has served on national committees advocating for burn survivors. She is a public speaker, raising awareness about burns, fire safety and burn prevention, along with encouraging fellow survivors on their road to recovery.

Special Guest:

BBQ Chef Ted Reader has graciously donated his time to come to this year's Family Day for Burn Survivors to cook for us. As many of you know, Ted Reader is a very active participant with Camp BuCKO and we welcome him to our event.

Teen Program:

An interactive day for teens aged 13-17. Through a variety of activities and sessions, teens living with and/or affected by a burn injury will have fun, share their experiences and learn from one another. Teens will have the opportunity to hear from adult burn survivors, learn more about Camp BUCKO, as well as participate with Young Peoples Theatre.
