The focus of ADHD Awareness month was ADHD across the lifespan. The conference was held at the Caboto Club on September 25, 2009, 830am. to 1pm. There were a number of lessons learned from previous years that facilitated a very successful event. Over 100 people of diverse backgrounds attended the workshop.

- A professional flyer, e-letter, poster and website facilitated wide distribution of conference information in a timely and repetitive manner.
- A one- day conference was able to meet most of the goals of raising awareness in our community.
- The location was also central and may have contributed to the increased turnout.

A summary of the evaluations revealed an average of 3.5 out of a maximum score of 4. The comments were extremely positive. The audience of teachers, parents, social workers and other health professionals commented on the high calibre of speakers and information learned.

Dr. Robert Hunt MD., an internationally known expert on ADHD across the lifespan was warmly received. Dr. Alison McInnes PhD, our own local talent, an assistant professor in the Education Department at the University of Windsor, gave the audience an inside look at the learning problems that Children and adolescents can present with.
