Summary: pair work, Battleships game

Directions:

Each student gets a worksheet. Practice making questions with the top grid ("Is there a ~ in your bedroom?" for column 1, "Are there ~ in your bedroom?" for column 2). Make sure students understand column one has singular objects and column 2 has plural objects. Have students write the appropriate heading for columns 2 and 3 (Are there/Is there, respectively).

Have students practice making answers (Yes, there is./No, there isn't/Yes, there are./No, there aren't.)

Make pairs. Each student circles 5 things from the top grid to be in his or her bedroom. Students take turns asking partners, "Is there a ~ in your bedroom?" or "Are there ~ in your bedroom." Students mark partner responses in the bottom grid.

The first student to find all 5 of their partner's things wins.
