“¿Y la segunda vez?” los niños le preguntaron a una voz.

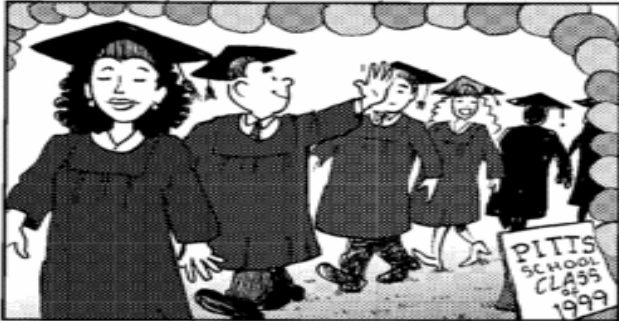

CONGRATULATIONS, GRADUATES!

THIS IS THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER TIME. We accompany Mary and the apostles as they strain to comprehend the incomprehensible, sharing this mysterious "afterglow" of the resurrection of Christ. For forty days He was around with them eating, drinking, talking, showing up and leaving. Then after forty days He left (physically) for good! In fifty days His spirit mysteriously and powerfully came and invigorated and energized them. During the sixth week of Easter time we celebrate (Thursday, June 2) the Feast of the Ascension (absence) of Christ (40 days after His resurrection). At the end of the seventh week, we celebrate the Feast of the Pentecost (50 days after His resurrection), the energizing of the Apostles by the Holy Spirit. Next Sunday is the beginning of the Seventh Week of Easter Time. We will now officially celebrate the Feast of the Ascension on the 7th Sunday so we can all be together to savor, share, and celebrate the mystery. We will celebrate a Mass on Ascension Thursday at 7:00 P.M. And all the Masses next weekend (June 4th & 5th) will be Masses of the Ascension, and will fulfill the obligation to celebrate the Great feast! So, Thursday is the 40th day, but we'll celebrate the BIG feast on Saturday (June 4th) & Sunday (June 5th) when we'll all be together!
