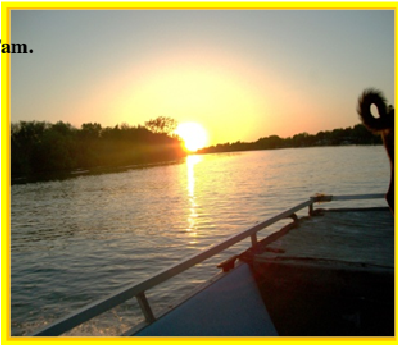

Cafeteria Catholicism

The priest agreed to try to answer his questions as best he could. The man went on: “Now, Father, I had left the Church because some things bothered me about it. I understand, though, that the Church has changed quite a bit in recent years. Is the Church still against abortion and contraceptives?”

“Yes,” the priest replied, “those things are against God’s law, and so the Church cannot agree to their practice.”

“What about Sunday collections? Does the parish still expect me to contribute?”

“Of course,” the priest said. “That is the way the parish keeps functioning. Everyone assumes his or her part.”
