When the Gift is Self

The Marquis of Lafayette was a hero of the American revolution. Yet we know little about him. Born Marie Joseph Paul Yves Roch Gilbert de Motier in 1757, this young man inherited a fortune from his dead parents. At age seventeen, he married Marie Adrienne Francoise de Noailles. But soon, another love entered his life.

Lafayette left his native France in 1777 to join the Americans in their struggle for freedom. He became a major general and a friend of George Washington. As a revolutionary he was wounded in battle, suffered the deprivations of winter encampment in Valley Forge, and narrowly escaped from General George Cornwallis' troops.

Lafayette went to France several times to plead for help for the Americans. At this period of his life, the Americans rewarded him with little more than sincere thanks.

What does Lafayette's involvement in the struggle for freedom for our country teach us? His example teaches that a generous person gives the gift of self.

In today's readings we see that lesson spelled out clearly for ourselves. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus said, "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.." (Mt. 10:39)

In the first reading, we see the example of a woman who is generous toward the prophet Elisha (2 Kgs. 4:8-16). Later, St. Paul wrote that our self-sacrifice must be made on behalf of Christ: "If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also with him." (Rm. 6:8)

We must learn from Lafayette and give the gift of self.



Cuando el regalo que damos es nosotros

El Marques de Lafayette fue un héroe dela Revolución Americana. Sin embargo, sabemos muy poco acerca de el. Cuando nació en 1757 le pusieron Marie Joseph Paul Yves Roch Gilbert de Motier y heredo una fortuna de sus padres ya muertos. Cuando tenia diecisiete años, se caso con Marie Adrienne Francoise de Noailles, pero pronto encontró un Nuevo Amor en su vida.

Lafayette dejó Francia, su país natal, en 1777 para unirse a los americanos en su lucha por la libertad. El lleo a ser un general en el ejercito Americano y un amigo de George Washington. Gomo revolucionario, el fue herido en batallas, sufrió las privaciones en el campamento en Valley Forge durante el invierno y por poco no se escapa de las tropas del General George Cornwallis.

Lafayette fue a Francia varias veces para pedir ayuda para los americanos. Durante esta época de su vida, los americanos lo recompensaron con solo poco mas que las gracias.

¿Qué podemos aprender del compromiso de Lafayette en la batalla por ganar la libertad de nuestro país? Su ejemplo nos ensena que una persona generosa da el regalo de su propia persona.

En las lecturas de hoy vemos esa lección para nosotros y la vemos muy claramente. En el evangelio de Mateo Jesús dijo, "El que procure salvar su vida la perderá, y el que la pierda por mi, la hallará." (Mt 10:39)

En la primera lectura vemos el ejemplo de una mujer que es muy generosa con el profeta Elias (2 Re. 4:8-16). Mas tarde, San Pablo escribió que nuestro sacrificio debe ser por Cristo: "Por lo tanto, si hemos muerto con Cristo, Creemos también que viviremos con el"

Tenemos que aprender de Lafayette y dar el regalo de nosotros mismos.
