### Ask for Anything

This may seem scandalous to us: A poor woman wants Jesus to expel a demon from her daughter and Jesus makes every effort to ignore the woman.

But here is another surprise. Jesus answers her request after all. In doing so, he breaks from the law of nature by curing someone outside the normal patterns of physical health and disease. And he breaks from the general boundaries of his mission by aiding a non-Jewish person.

Jesus has been sent on a limited mission by his father. He is to announce God's kingdom to the Jews, not to all the world. He is to train a small group of apostles to take that news to the rest of the world. This woman is not Jewish; she is a Gentile.

So, why does he grant the request of the woman? Out of compassion. The God who is love cannot turn away from creature of his who is in trouble.

If we do not find the Lord coming to our rescue in all our times of difficulty, we must remember that he wants to follow the normal patterns he's created. And perhaps what we would see as compassionate may not be such in the sight of God. Perhaps something that we request, were it granted, could result in real harm to us.

At the same time, the compassion of Jesus is just as strong toward us today as it was for the woman in the story we read at Mass. We should not hesitate to ask for anything, and we should be humbly grateful for whatever we receive.

Esto puede que nos parezca un poco escandaloso: Una mujer pobre quiere que Jesús cure a su hija, atormentada por un demonio, y Jesús hace todo lo posible por ignorar a la mujer.

Pero aquí tenemos otra sorpresa. Jesús responde a su petición después de todo. Al hacerlo, él no sigue la ley de la naturaleza al curar a alguien que no tiene una enfermedad normal. Y él no sigue los confines generales de su misión al ayudar a una persona que no es judía.

Jesús ha sido enviado por su Padre a cumplir una misión limitada. El debe anunciar el Reino de Dios a los judíos no a todo el mundo. El debe entrenar un grupo pequeño de apóstoles para llevar esta buena nueva al resto del mundo. Esta mujer no es judía; ella es una pagana.

Por lo tanto, ¿Por qué es que él le concede la petición a la mujer? Por compasión. El Dios que es amor no puede darle la espalda a una criatura suya que tiene problemas.

Si no vemos que el Señor viene a ayudarnos cada vez que tenemos un problema, tenemos que recordar que él quiere seguir los patrones normales que él ha creado. Y quizá lo que consideramos misericordioso no lo es ante los ojos de Dios. Quizá algo que hemos pedido, si se nos concede, podría causarnos daños.

Al mismo tiempo, Jesús siente tanta compasión hacia nosotros como sintió hacia la mujer en la historia que leímos en la Misa. No debemos vacilar cuando pedimos, y debemos agradecer humildemente todo lo que recibamos.

**COLLEGE STUDENTS** who want to ask for a special blessing before you take off for your great struggles with the books can do so after mass, we're all going to be praying for you!

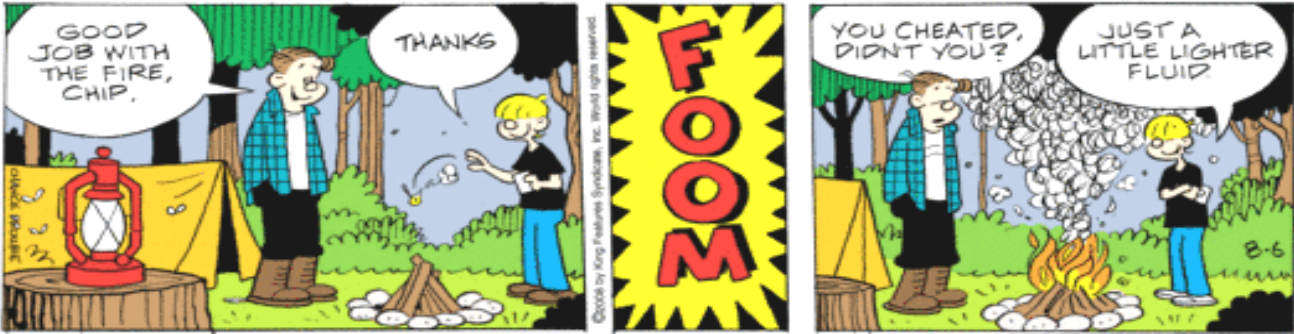
