



SAINTS AMONG US



These genuine modern-day heroes have been eclipsed by celebrities form the world of show business.

The Church today celebrates the Feast of All Saints, a day on which we honor all the holy men and women, who throughout the ages lived and died with one purpose: to give honor and glory to God and to foster the well-being of their neighbor.
