

Mary, Mother of God

That may gave birth to Jesus helps us to reflect on two important facts: Jesus is truly God, and he is truly human.

Jesus is truly God. In the book of Revelation, all those qualities are ascribed to Jesus that in other places in the Bible are assigned to God.

He is described as having "hair... as white as snow-white wool," which indicates His eternity. "His eyes blaze like fire" indicates his ability to know all things. "His voice sounds like the roar of rushing waters" indicates His power over all things. He is the One who lives forever and ever. In John's Gospel, the skeptic, Thomas, professes his faith

in Jesus by declaring: "My Lord and my God!" **Jesus is truly human.** Jesus is truly God, but he is also the Son of Mary. Therefore, Jesus is truly and completely

human. In the first letter of John, the evangelist says he speaks of Jesus, whom he has heard, seen, and touched. In the Gospel of John, the risen Christ asks doubtful Thomas to put his fingers in the nail-holes in Jesus' hands. He is truly human.

The Gospel tells us that Mary reflected upon all these things and treasured them in her heart. The greatest blessing for us would be a deeper realization for ourselves of what it means to say that Jesus is true God and true man. This realization comes to us only in reflection and prayer.





Maria, Madre de Dios

Jesús es verdaderamente Dios. En el libro del Apocalipsis, todas las cualidades que en otros lugares en la Biblia se le atribuyen a Dios, aquí se la atribuyen a Jesús.

En la primera carta de Juan, el evangelista dice que él habla de Jesús, a quien ha escuchado, visto, y tocado. En el Evangelio de Juan, el Cristo resucitado le pide al incrédulo Tomás que meta sus dedos en donde estuvieron los clavos en sus manos. El es verdaderamente humano.

El Evangelio nos dice que Maria observaba cuidadosamente todos los acontecimientos y los guardaba en su corazón. La mejor bendición para nosotros seria una realización personal más profunda de la que significa decir que Jesús es verdadero Dios y verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre. Esta realización nos viene solamente por medio de la reflexión y la oración.
