Parable of the Garden

In the garden of life, God has planted many kinds of trees. There is the Tree of Service, a very tall tree. One needs the gift of perseverance in order to climb its branches and pick its fruit. There is the Tree of Temptation, its branches are very thin and delicate. One can easily fall, and so safeguards must be taken. There is the Tree of Suffering, which is covered with thorns. To gather its fruit, one needs the gifts of patience and meekness.

All the trees in the garden are watered with the Word of God. And workers in the garden need to wear the apron of prayer in order to gather fruit for the Owner of the garden. This apron is woven of three kinds of fabric: Prayer for One’s Own, Prayer for One’s Community, and Prayer for the Community of Heaven.

The workers in the garden learn from the Chief Gardener, the Son of the Owner of the garden. By example, he shows the workers the way of perseverance in gathering the fruits of service. He instructs the workers in prudence and self-control so that they may be unscathed at the Tree of Temptation. He has gathered the fruits of the Tree of Suffering by his own patience and meekness. He gives the Word of God to his workers, so they may water the garden. And He has woven for the workers the aprons of prayer, so they may work without anxiety. In the end, he and His Father invite the workers to join them in consuming the fruits of their labors in the banquet of Love.

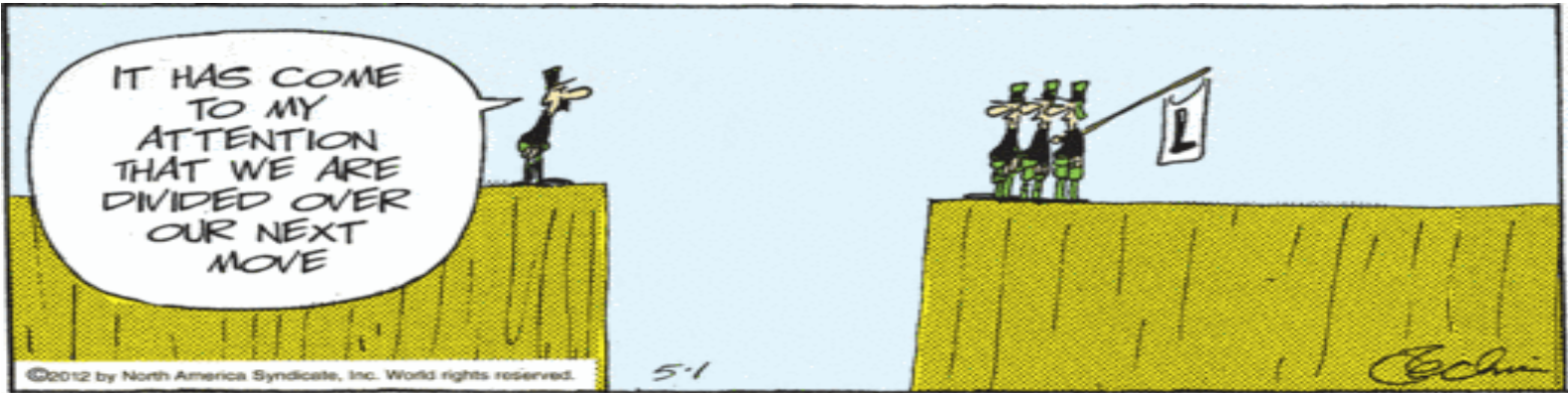

Next Sunday is Mother's Day and probably will be our last Sunday in the Church for a while! It'll be a beautiful day and then some inconvenience and stress as we adjust to using the Parish hall for Mass for probably around 9-10 months. It will be a little(?) disturbing and distressing, but we'll handle it well as our Parish has ever since the days of La Lomita. A guiding principle, since we first began to talk with each other about this project, has always been to repair and expand, but not to "modernize" or remodel. What you see when you drive up and when you come in will be pretty much the same, just roomier. Same brick, same floor tile, same windows (with some new ones) same façade, same sanctuary, (same old priests!).

Our dream of saving all we needed looked good until about six months ago. It looks more like we have 2/3-3/4 of what we'll need already saved. That means by the end of the project we'd need to borrow money to finish. The Bishop's finance council has pre-approved us for a loan if and when that time comes. We have two million saved: How much more will it take? Well, maybe almost another million. That'll give us plenty to worry about and work on! ¡Que cosas! Now, Mr. Noser, our contractor will be able to get the ball rolling. Yeah, it's turning my hair white, too, and Fr. Jim and Fr. Philion have lost theirs already! **It's gonna be a great adventure!** We'll all rise to the challenge!
