Confirmation Class

A catechism teacher was preparing her students for confirmation when one day she presented a riddle to them: "What gift can you receive only when you already have it and possess only when you give it away?"

The students were stumped.

To help them answer the riddle, the teacher asked other questions. "How many of you have done some kindness for someone this week?" Hands slowly went up as each student reviewed what kindness he or she had done that week. Some had visited elderly relatives. Others had tried to be particularly helpful at home by doing the laundry or the housecleaning. One young man had visited a friend in the hospital, and one of the young women regularly volunteered at a day care center.

"What do we call such kind actions?" The teacher asked. She had to prompt the answer; "Love."

"And who is the Holy Spirit of God?"

Most responded, "The Third Person of the Blessed Trinity," which was correct, but the teacher added another perspective.

"The Third Person of the Blessed Trinity is the Holy Spirit of God's Love, whom God the Father and God the Son share with each other and want to share with us. "She explained that every kind, loving action in their lives was prompted by the Spirit of Love. And they can receive God's Spirit of Love only if they have the Spirit of Love. They know they possess the Spirit of Love only if they give love to God and to the other people in their lives.

Ella les explico que cada favor o acto de amor que hacían era motivado por el Espíritu del Amor. Y ellos podían recibir el Espíritu del Amor de Dios solamente si tenían el Espíritu del Amor. Ellos saben que poseen el Espíritu del Amor solamente si pueden darle amor a Dios y a otras personas que son parte de sus vidas.
