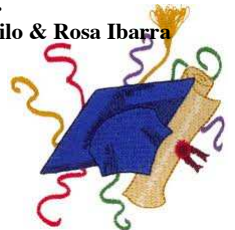

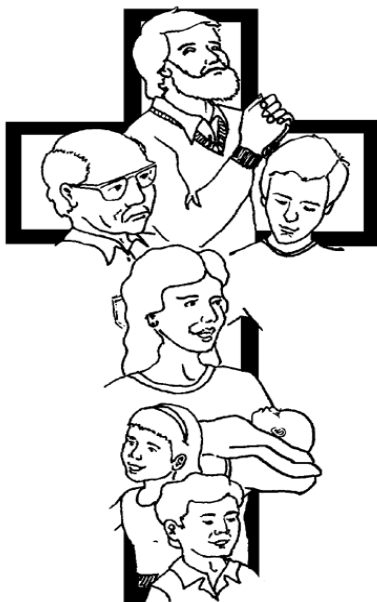
Paul tells us: "...the Lord Jesus on the night in which he was betrayed took bread, and after he had give thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same we, after the supper, he took the cup, saying, 'This is the cup of the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.' Every time, then, you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he come! (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)

Jesus wanted his disciples to see his broken body on the Cross and his blood poured out so we could see the extent of His love.

The Father withholds His hand from punishment of the most heinous crime the world will ever see: the Crucifixion of the Son of God. This we see in Jesus' sacrifice the abundant mercy of God.

And Jesus uses the opportunity of His own death to show us the Resurrection. "For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, God will bring forth with him from the dead those also who have fallen asleep believing in him." (1 Thessalonians 4:14)

For this reason, Jesus can declare about himself: "He who feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has life eternal, and I will raise him up on the last day." (John 6:54)

Jesús quiso que sus discípulos vieran su cuerpo quebrado en la cruz y su sangre vertida para que viéramos la magnitud de su amor.

La mano del Padre no interfiere para castigar el crimen más horrible del mundo: la crucifixión del Hijo de Dios.

Y Jesús usa la ocasión de su propia muerte como oportunidad para mostrarnos la resurrección. "Pues creemos que Jesús murió para después resucitar, y de la misma manera los que ahora descansan, Dios los devolverá por Jesús y junto a él." (1 Tesalonicenses 4, 14)

Por esto es que Jesús puede hacer esta declaración: "El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, viva de vida eterna, y yo lo resucitare en el último día." (Juan 6, 54)
