

BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST (A BIBLE STUDY)

Jesus paid John the Baptist a great tribute when he said "...among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist..." (Mt. 11:11). What was so special about John the Baptizer to merit such praise?

Luke used phrases from the Old Testament to tell of John's birth (Gn. 15:3; 16:1; 25:21; 29:31; 30:1; Jgs. 13:2-3; 1 Sm. 1:2). He explained how John's parents, Zecheriah and Elizabeth, conceived John in a miraculous way (Lk. 1:5-25). And Luke expressed the joy of John's parents over his birth (Lk. 1:39-80).

After John grew to maturity, he accepted the life of a prophet. In his mission, he called for true repentance. He told people to prepare for the coming of the Messiah (Lk. 3:1-18; Mt. 3:1-12).

John even baptized Jesus. In the process, God remarkable revealed Jesus' divinity. (Mt. 3:13-17). John then bore special witness to Jesus. He proclaimed that Jesus is the Lamb of God who will be sacrificed to take away the sin of the world (Jn. 1:19-34, 6-9, 15).

Because of John's forthright preaching, he made enemies of government officials. They executed him (Mt. 14:3-12).

What is even more remarkable than Jesus' praises for John is Jesus' praises for us. "...The least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

LA NACIMIENTO DE JUAN BAUTISTA (UN ESTUDIO DE LA BIBLIA) Jesús honró mucho a Juan Bautista cuando él dijo, "Yo les aseguro que no se ha presentado entre los hombres alguien más grande que Juan Bautista" (Mt. 11.11) Por qué es Juan Bautista tan especial? ¿Por qué se merece este cumplido y tal alabanza?

Lucas usó frases del Antiguo Testamento para hablar del nacimiento de Juan (Gen. 15.3; 16.1; 25.21;29.31;30.1; Jue. 13.2-3; 1 Sam. 1.2) El explico cómo los padres de Juan, Sacarias e Isabel, concibieron a Juan de una manera milagrosa (lc. 1.5-25). Y Lucas expresó la alegría de los padres de Juan cuando él nació (Lc. 1.39-80).

Despues que Juan creció y maduró, el aceptó la vida y la misión de un profeta. En su misión, el pidió un arrepentimiento verdadero. El los dijo a los personas que se prepararan para la venida del Mesías (Lc. 31-18); Mt. 3.1-12).

Juan hasta bautizo a Jesus. Mientras lo hacia, Dios reveló la dicinidad de Jesus de una manera extraordinaria (Mt. 3.13-17). Juan entonces dio un testimonio especial de Jesus. El proclamó que Jesus es el Cordero de Dios quien será sacrificadeo para quitar el pecado del mundo (Jn. 1.19-34.6-9.15)

Debido a que Juan predico con tanta sinceridad y franqueza, él busco enemigos entre los oficiales del gobierno. Ellos lo mataron (Mt. 14.3-12).

Pero lo que todavía es más increíble es que el cumplido de Jesus le dio a Juan es un cumplido que Jesus nos da a nosotros. "...el mas pequeño en el Reino de los Cielos es más que él (Juan Bautista)" (Mt. 11.11). Juan fue la persona más grande del Antiguo Testamento, como un nuevo profeta Elias. Nosotros, sin embargo, tenemos el privilegio de vivir en la época del Nuevo Testamento, conociendo a Jesús, estando en comunión, intima con él y poseyendo su Espiritu (Lc. 10.23-24).

This weekend we celebrate the 4th Sunday after Pentecost, the 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time. It coincides with the feast of the birth of John the Baptist which is a bigger deal. He was Christ's cousin, the great character who prepared the way for Christ to come into our world, our hearts and minds. Like that salty character, John, we're each created to be, in our own unique way, a messenger and instrument of God's creative energy, love and goodness in our world. It's really true and it's really a great adventure!

The reading of today's mass, especially the gospel, speak of how, like John the Baptist, we become the characters we are, who we were meant to be, and it's by fidelity to Christ!! We don't run away from sacrifice, self-discipline and the tough decisions and realities of life! Even as we relax and loaf (a little) in the summer, we refresh ourselves to better recognize and respond to Christ. How do we work this out? What do we deny ourselves? What do we discipline ourselves to do? How do we figure it out? Pues... we figure it out in response to the movement of His spirit in us. It ain't easy, but it's great!! It's really the only way to go!! As the Lord says, "He who seeks only himself brings himself to ruin, whereas he who sacrifices (disciplines) himself discovers and develops who he is."

We celebrated the day of St. Thomas More on Friday and this weekend St. John the Baptist. Two great hearted and valiant characters who stood up, stood out as lights in the darkness by way of their fidelity to Christ at work in their hearts, their fidelity to the TRUTH, GOODNESS and BEAUTY of God in us and in our world. As we make our way through the 21st century, we ask them to pray for us and with us. Now, who is it that says, "You've to stand up for something or you'll fall for anything?"

BEING A LOYAL LEMMING AIN'T ALWAYS THE HEALTHIEST THING!

A wonderful honest young person recently mentioned a problem she had with religion class and the Church.

In religion class, she kept hearing the advice, "Be yourself." On the other hand, she pointed out that the Church keeps telling us what we are supposed to believe and how we are supposed to act. Isn't there a huge conflict between being ourselves and being Catholic?

If you have similar feelings now and then, keep a couple of thoughts in mind: You are not the first to have them, and you are not a rotten, religiously uncool being in the sight of God, either. (God is far more understanding of us than we are of each other.)

Quite a few people experience a "Be yourself vs. the Church says" hassle from time to time. Let's see if we can sort it out a bit. We—the Church—will always be challenged to deepen our knowledge of God and sort out what he has revealed to us. Religion touches us very personally and deeply. Whatever bottom line we arrive at in religion, if we take it seriously, is going to affect drastically the way we live.

It may help you to consider some of the Church's rules in this way. The Church isn't really a dictator shouting, "This is how you are going to act... Why? Because I said so that's why!" If you have met some individual who does come on that way, just remember he or she does not represent the way Jesus wanted his Church to act. It is more like someone (and someone who cares) saying, "Hey, you're going to get yourself messed up, or you'll hurt other people if you act this way or that."

The Church tries to pass along God's design for you. And God's design is not just a set of dumb rules he made up to see if you can take it. God is not, for example, a really tough soccer coach who says you have to run twenty extra laps just to see how obedient you are. God's rules are there because he knows what is good and what will actually make you happy when it comes to the bottom line. (Have you ever noticed how many people who have so much money and power that they can do anything they want—or almost anything—end up miserable?)

What happens if all this sounds fairly OK, but you still have a problem with this or that particular teaching of the Church?

- 1. Try as well as you can to figure out why you have a problem with it. This is called keeping yourself honest, and it is something everybody has to do. Do you experience a genuinely upsetting wrestling with the problem or would you just prefer it weren't there because your life would be easier that way? You need to make sure you are not acting likes someone who argues that it is stupid to have first base so far away from home plate because it would be easier to get on base if it were closer.
- 2. If your problem is real and genuine and honest, you need to realize that the people with whom you disagree are not the enemy. And they, of course, should realize that you are not the enemy either.
- You pray about it. A lot. Not "Lord, please give me victory over those stupid turkeys who can't see how dumb they are," but "Lord, I'm having trouble with 3. something that I know is fairly important. I need your help to sort it out." And, "Lord, Please help me day by day to be faithful to you and so, to be true to myself."

Oh my God! Our sweet old Guadalupe church is sure looking lonesome and messed up. It is pretty upsetting, but it's leading to something really beautiful and hospitable for our community. So, what's going to happen? Well, the idea is pretty simple, but the project is complicated. We'll get some sketches out in the bulletin soon. The walls in the middle section where the side roof is will move out 30 ft. on each side. We'll keep the same look and feel, but have much more room. The façade, sanctuary, and tower will all end up looking the same. The altar we say Mass on will be a little further out front and the high section of the sanctuary floor will be bigger. Our Lady of Guadalupe and the high altar will still be where and how it has always been. I pray that we'll all be real pleased next Spring when it's all done! Until then, our fine O.L.G hall/ Chapel Adjunct- Summer place is serving us very well and we're all relieved and encouraged by the enthusiastic response to our move. Somebody told me last week that our hall/ temporary church is prettier than a lot of churches. Ain't that sweet? It seems like we are able to seat as many or maybe even a few more in the Parish Hall set up as we did in the Church. Not bad! We'll survive and thrive like we have since the days of La Lomita and the Cavalry of Christ! Thanks to everybody for your generosity, good will, and to all our good helpers and volunteers. This move was no small project, but it sure turned out nice!

People are already interested in our beautiful, old short benches from the church. Of course, you've noticed that we're using them now very well in our new temporary set up. What about later, after we've all moved back into the beautiful old Guadalupe, all repaired and expanded? Well, we'll probably sell some, raffle some, and keep some. It would be a good way to beef up the building fund and we'll need to beef it up!!

Our fine "Asociacion Guadalupana" is already raising funds for the building project with a good raffle. Please pitch in! \$3 a ticket, or 2 for \$5. We'll need to make an extra effort to pull it off and I know we will! If 3,000 of us each gave an extra dollar a day (price of a beer maybe?) We'd have \$1,095,000 by this time next year. Ain't that something? I'm gonna get out a coffee can and start now! We are going to need lots of EXTRA help on this beautiful project! Families, classes, groups, individuals are already pitching in and making great plans! What a fine old parish!

Speaking of pitching in... The Bishop's Appeal got thrown off by this move... So, we'll extend it into June. If you haven't yet, please get an envelope and pitch in what you can. Every "little bit" helps! The response so far is a little wimpy... not typical for us here at the Guadalupe! Of the thousands of us who pray & belong here, only about 150 have responded to the Appeal! Please pitch in <u>SOMETHING</u> this month! (Actually, Fr. Roy still hasn't pitched in either, but he's "fixin' to." So can YOU!

iFelicidades! Congratulations to our fine Parish School. We re-opened in 2004 after having closed in '84, but we had to be accredited again and that takes lots of time and work. Well, we just got our official notice from the accreditation commission of the Texas Catholic Conference that we are now fully accredited! Way to go Guadalupe
