OUR CALL TO HAPPINESS

A Redemptorist missionary working in Brazil described how a teenager taught him the meaning of happiness. The teen said, "Aunt Till will never be in heaven. She is only happy when she complains and in heaven there is nothing to complain about!" Aunt Tilly's attitude points out what Abraham Lincoln once said, "Most folks are about as happy as they make up their minds to be." Nevertheless, we do try to find pathways to happiness.

The German writer, Johann Wolfgang Von Goethe suggested "Nine requisites for contented living: 1) health enough to make work a pleasure; 2) wealth enough to support your needs; 3) strength enough to battle with difficulties; 4) grace enough to confess your sins and overcome them; 5) patience enough to toil until some good is accomplished; 6) charity enough to see some good in your neighbor; 7) love enough to make you to be useful and helpful to other; 8) faith enough to make real the things of God; 9) hope enough to remove all anxious fear concerning the future."

Jesus define happiness more precisely: be poor in spirit, mourn with the sorrowful, be meek, hunger and thirst for justice, be merciful, clean of heart, and seek peace. If we are persecuted for His sake, we should rejoice because ours is the kingdom of heaven (Mt. 5:3-11).

Ultimately, we find happiness in God's love for us: "Love can be happy; those who love so good a God should never allow dark and gloomy thoughts to enter their hearts. (Saint Alphonsus Liguori)



Nuestra llamada a ser felices

Un misionero redentorista que trabajaba en Brasil describio como un joven le enseno el significado de la felicidad. El joven le dijo: "Mi tia Tula nunca va a ir al Cielo. Ella solo se siente feliz cuando se esta quejando y en el Cielo no hay nada de que quejarse!" La actitud de la tia Tula describe lo que Abraham Lincoln dijo una vez: "La mayoria de las personas son tan felices como deciden que van a serlo". Sin embargo, tratamos de encontrar maneras de llegar a felicidad.

El escritor aleman Johann Wolfgang Von Goethe surgio "nueve requisitos para vivir felices: 1) salud suficiente para que el trabajo sea un placer; 2) dinero suficiente para cubrir las necesidades; 3) fuerza suficiente para enfrentarnos a las dificultades; 4) gracia suficiente para confesar los pecados y sobrepasarlos; 5) paciencia suficiente para trabajar hasta lograr algun bien; 6) caridad suficiente para ver el bien en el proximo; 7) amor suficiente para ayudar y beneficiar a los demas; 8) fe suficiente para eliminar las ansiedades que sentimos en relacion al futuro".

Jesús definio la felicidad mas detalladamente: ser pobre de espiritu, llorar con los que sufren, ser humildes, tener hambre y sed de justicia, ser compasivos, ser de corazon limpio y trabajar por la paz. Si nos persiguen por causa de Jesús debemos alegrarnos porque es nuestro el Reino de los Cielos (Mt 5, 3-11).

El ultimo caso, encontramos la felicidad en el amor que de Dios nos tiene: "Ama y se feliz, aquellos que aman a un Dios tan bueno nunca deben dejar que pensamientos tristes y negativos entren en sus corazones" (San Alfonso Liguori).
