Course description:

The objective of this course is to review the state of the art in the labor field with respect to applied theory, structural estimation procedures, and experimental design. We will review the latest papers from the field exemplifying these approaches and then practice applying these approaches in paper topics of the students' choosing. The development of these papers will be guided by periodic presentations and group discussions.

Learning objectives:

This course is open to PhD students wishing to learn about the frontier of topics, methods, and practices in the field of labor economics. The objective is to learn how to identify open questions in strands of literature, construct applied theoretical frameworks, design and implement defensible identification strategies, and contextually interpret results.
