☑ Prepare in Advance

Facilitator: In advance of the session:

- Go to the following website, One Step Forward (link provided on this session's webpage) and print out the list of the seven human-made wonders of the world. Familiarize yourself with these attractions for the opening exercise.
- Review today's scripture text and the session activities to help better facilitate the discussion.
- Have the Bible Background Video ready to view.

Explore

- As you begin, ask the following introductory question: Here is a list of the seven human-made wonders of the world. How many can you name without looking?
- What modern structures would you include that are not on this list?
- Have someone read Mark 13:1-8 out loud and show the Bible Background Video.

☑ The End of All Things

- What did the disciples ask Jesus (verses 3-4)? What kind of information did they desire to know, and what did Jesus give in response?
- If time permits, have someone read the rest of this chapter. How specific was Jesus' information – did he give them any real clues as to when they could expect these things? Why do you think Jesus was so vague?
- Why is it significant that he gave the disciples signs not to worry about?
- Based on this information, do you think Jesus' goal in this conversation was to teach about the End Times? If not, what might his goal (or goals) have been?

Things that Last

- Look back at the list from the opening exercise. Why do we find these human-made structures so aweinspiring?
- Is it wrong to find awe and joy in the creativity and intelligence of human beings? Explain.
- How can these kinds of human accomplishments reflect the glory of God?

- Why do you think Jesus responded this way when the disciples marveled at the magnificent man-made temple (verses 1-2)?What might his response say about their misplaced wonder?
- In what ways can our trust in impressive human accomplishments replace our reverence and trust in God?
- What things will really last (see verse 31 for an example), and why should we place our trust in these things?

Closing

Pray something like: Creator God, you are the author of everything. As we find wonder in your creation and in your creatures, overwhelm us with your glory and love for us!
