## Call to Order 9:03 a.m. 51 Members in Attendance

## **Approval of October Minutes**

<u>President's Report</u> Thank you principal, teachers and parents. The school year is off to a great start.

## Principal's Report

- The student council members have been selected: Liam and Audrey.
- 3rd grade is performing for the Hudson Guild Senior Citizen Center today.
- The Science Fair will be held Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>, 2014 for 3<sup>rd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> grade and so far everything is going really well. The groups have been meeting according to their set schedule.
- Kindergarten through 2nd grade has been participating in the Science Discovery Center.
- The cast of the 5th grade play, Annie, will be announced tomorrow.
- The 4th graders will be going to see The Nutcracker soon and one of our students is performing in the show.
- 3rd grade is participating in Chess instruction
- 2nd grade is participating in Circle in the Square.
- The CEP has been approved by the superintendent and will be on the DOE website.
- We will be having two or three performance assessments on non-fiction. This type of work is included in the state test.
- We are focusing on 'writing on reading' for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4th and 5th grades.
- Math fluency is also another focal point, memorizing is important but we also have the kids learning how to understand math.

# Treasurer's Report

- For the period ending October 31st the PTA raise \$89,000 and incurred \$99,000 of program expenditures. The PTA ended the month with approximately 216k thousand cash on hand.
- The annual fund drive is gaining momentum with to date donations totaling \$70,000 from 97 families. This amount excludes: \$14,000 online donations from 33 families made between October 19th and 31<sup>st</sup>, as these online transactions were not deposited into the bank account until November.
- The Fall Festival grossed approximately \$4,000 from the Etsy craft fair, \$3,100 from bake sale, \$4,200 from Raffles, \$4,600 from admissions/lunch and \$2,300 from Halla's clothing sale. After deducting expenses net proceeds are \$12,000. Art and craft supplies and game prizes were donated by parents. Thank you Dara and volunteers.
- Other funds raised during October include Parent Night out at the Living Room which raised \$2,300 and the Amazon school rewards program which brought in \$600.
- On the expense side school is in full swing. We wrote \$72,800 of checks in October.
  Major expenses include \$4,200 literacy and math development, \$1,800 for parental
  involvement programs, \$40,000 for school support (recess, cook shop, Farm Market,
  home folders, lice check, and staff welcome breakfast) & \$26,800 for enrichment
  (camping, chess, science, Book of the Month, pottery program, Pascal dance and
  Nutcracker trip)

## **Fundraising Report**

\*Annual fund thank you for everyone who donated to the annual fund.

- Annual Fund Grade Challenge: Kindergarten has won the grade challenge and will get an ice cream party held by 16 Handles. First grade was not far behind; the next challenge day is 1/15/14. The grade to reach 80% by that date will get a pizza party.
- AF to date: \$158,628.81. We have another \$10,000 in credit card commitments. Our goal is \$300,000. Please check with your company to see if they do matching. Any amount counts, what we really need is high participation.
