Are you tired of walking through garbage every time you leave home? I am. Let's do something about it! Garbage makes our streets look unclean and making too much of it is not taking care of our world. So, I wonder how we can keep New York City clean?

I spoke with Mr. Ignazio "Iggy" Terranova, the Citywide Community Affairs Officer of the NYC Department of Sanitation and asked him why there is so much garbage on our streets. He said there are 3

problems. One is that people litter. "There is garbage on the streets because people do not throw it away properly." Second, the litter doesn't get picked up. "Property owners do not sweep up properly in front of their homes or stores. They are responsible for cleaning 18 inches into the street from the sidewalk at least twice a



day." Third, the street bins overflow and garbage falls on the ground, leaving no place to put our junk. According to Iggy, "The issue with the corner litter baskets is that they are designed for pedestrian trash (coffee cups, napkins, etc.), but people bring their household or commercial trash to the corners. They might do this because they don't want to store their trash in the house until pick-up." They might also do it because not all the garbage fits in their building garbage area.

How can we solve these problems? Think more carefully about what you are throwing away and RECYCLE instead of creating all this trash. According to the Sierra Club of NYC every New Yorker makes 3 pounds of garbage a day! Since we don't have any landfills here, we have to ship it to other states. This costs the city 300 million dollars per year to get rid of. That's a lot of money! With money we save by recycling, the sanitation department could make commercials that remind people that littering is bad and that they will be fined if they use the street bins for their home garbage. The commercials could use famous people to create awareness.

If YOU make trash, don't litter. Put it in a garbage can. If it's full, take it with you. Don't just throw it next to the can. If your home garbage bin is full, buy a bigger bin or get another one. The next time you're finishing your favorite soda, think of how you hate seeing garbage in the streets and be part of the solution! •


This time, he ended up in 1924 at Albert Einstein's laboratory! He told Einstein that he was bored with time travel and didn't want to do it
