Meeting came to order: 9:05 a.m.

Welcome/Approval of September Minutes. September minutes are approved by a general vote of the membership.

Principal's Report (Bob Bender)

Activities Are Gearing Up. There are a number of things going on in the school. Among them: Kindergarten has started their education in dance program. Third grade has started their Circle in the Square Playwriting program. Chess has started for second grade. Third grade is rehearsing their Thanksgiving play and the fifth grade is beginning rehearsals for Shrek.

Showcase Visit. We are preparing for our first showcase visit in early November.

Parent Teacher Conferences. They are coming up the first week of November. The format will be a bit different than in previous years. Usually, teachers do a formal round of assessments in September and another round just before parent teacher conferences. However because we had so few instructional days in September, teachers have only just finished the first round of assessments. It doesn't make sense to do it again before the upcoming conferences. In your conferences, you will see assessments for September. In December, just before the holiday break, portfolios will come home and you will see assessments for December. After that, we'll be back on track on a normal assessment schedule with formal assessments every six weeks.

Bylaws. Last month we proposed two changes in the language of the bylaws in preparation for a vote this meeting.

-Change 1: A motion was made to change the job description of the board position of Vice President of community membership to Vice President of Volunteer Coordination and Community Outreach. The new language is meant to make the duties of the position clearer. A vote is taken. The motion is passed unanimously.

-Change 2: A motion was made to change the monthly PTA meeting from every third Wednesday of the month to every third Friday of the month, because many people say office schedules are more conducive to attending Friday meetings. A vote is taken. The motion is passed unanimously.

-An additional motion. An additional motion is proposed, to be voted upon during the next meeting. The motion: To change the language regarding family donations to the annual fund from “each family shall be requested to make a voluntary donation of \$500” to “each family shall be requested to make a voluntary donation of \$500 per student.” This will be voted upon at the next meeting.
