

Frontier Public Schools Child Find Notice

Child Find is a process designed to identify, locate, and evaluate individuals (birth through 21 years of age) with disabilities who may need special education services. Under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and other federal laws, public school districts must make a free appropriate public education available to eligible children with disabilities, ages 3 through 21.

The earlier that a child is identified as having a disability or delay the sooner he or she may begin receiving intervention services that will make a world of difference in a child's life. The sooner a parent, guardian, family member, or friend contacts us for help, the faster we can get started making a positive impact in the life of another child.

The types of disabilities covered include autism, deaf-blindness, developmental delays, emotional disturbance, hearing impairment including deafness, intellectual disabilities, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairments, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairments, traumatic brain injury, and visual impairment including blindness.
