## FOIA Reform Bill Struck Down in House



The FOIA Reform Bill passed unanimously by Senate Judiciary Committee in November was struck down in the House last week by Speaker John Boehner (R., Ohio). The bill had passed smoothly in the House earlier this year with a unanimous vote of 410-0. It then moved to the Sen. Judiciary Committee where it passed yet again with unanimous support. The bill has been championed by

Sen. Patrick Leahy (D., Vt.) but was met with opposition from Sen. Jay Rockefeller (D., W. Va.). A storm of Twitter posts, emails, and phone calls from watchdogs and a bipartisan group of Senators headed by Leahy worked to calm any objections. In early December, the bill passed through the Senate. After finally pushing through to the House, Speaker Boehner immediately tabled the bill.

Highlights of the proposed bill included a more lax fee policy on documents older than 25 years and requirements for federal agencies to act with a "presumption of openness". The bill would also limit overuse of exemptions to withhold information from requestors. "The Freedom of Information Act is one of our Nation's most important laws. It is about giving Americans greater access to their government and to hold government accountable," said Senator Leahy. Leahy blames Boehner for killing the FOIA reform bill last week.

## Tips and Tricks

### Did you know that FOIAXpress/PAL/RX v9.2 was released on 11/28/2014?

We are pleased to announce the release of eCase – FOIAXpress, eCase – ATIPXpress, PAL, and RedactXpress version 9.2. This version is part of our major annual release that includes stability improvements to our current product suite lineup (v9.0.32.0), as well as some eagerly anticipated enhancements, and added functionality.

If you have not yet upgraded your application to v9.0.32.0 (and are still using v8.0.7.1), then please upgrade using the latest version 9.2 setup package in order to take full advantage of the product suite benefits. However, if you're already using v9.0.32.0, then we still recommend an upgrade to version 9.2 at your earliest convenience.

*Note: To all of our current ADR customers on version 9.0.32.0, this release version 9.2 does not currently extend support for Oracle DB. Version 9.2 ADR has a pre-requisite requirement for MS SQL Server as the Database server.*

For our hosted customers, please be advised that your primary AINS point of contact has already notified your agency's eFOIA project lead to plan for your v9.2 upgrade schedule. However, if you have any issues or concerns, then please contact the AINS Support Team for assistance.

We would like to thank our customers for their invaluable input as we continue to enhance our AINS product suite. Your continued support enables us to improve our software, allowing AINS to remain the top provider of eFOIA product solutions.
