Parish Nursing - What is it?

Parish Nursing was introduced to the UK in 2005 by Rev Dr Helen Wordsworth who believed the concept could work here, as well as in the USA where it originated in the 1980s. Today, Parish Nursing is practiced in over 20 countries. There are nearly 100 PNs in the UK. Parish Nursing is a way for registered nurses who belong to any Christian denomination to provide a service from their local church to both the church and wider communities.

The nurse will attend a residential training course provided by <u>Parish Nursing Ministries UK</u> (PNMUK) and, in agreement with the church leadership, begin a service providing whole person health care incorporating mind, body and spirit.

The service will be dependent upon the skill set of the nurse and the vision of the church. Many Parish Nurses provide support groups, drop in sessions and 1:1 appointments offering health advice, support, preventative health care and screening. Spiritual care can be demonstrated in various ways, including prayer with the client's consent.

A Parish Nurse may work in a voluntary or paid role. PNMUK provide ongoing support/training to ensure nurses can maintain registration and revalidation. The Parish Nurse may still choose to work for the NHS or other provider.

Parish Nurses do not perform invasive procedures or do the same work as a District Nurse, but can provide services that complement statutory ones, with the value of time to spend with those who access their care. More information: ruth.mcdonald.pn@gmail.com

How can Cumbria CVS help your church?

CUMDIIC Cumbria CVS is a membership organisation, registered charity and company limited by CVS guarantee. It provides support to third sector organisations in Cumbria, including community and voluntary groups and churches, Churches Together groups and other faith groups. It aims to develop, connect and give a voice to third sector organisations across Cumbria.

Support: Includes general advice and information; training; organisational development; funding advice; business planning; quality assurance and volunteering.

Develop: Comprehensive programme of training for staff, trustees and volunteers: e.g. fundraising, business planning, supervision and appraisal, roles and responsibilities of Trustees, active listening, befriending, communication skills. Shares good practice in volunteer management; offers training and support for those responsible for managing volunteers; and supports the recruitment of volunteers. Through the Listening Ear project, volunteers support people to greater independence by connecting them with appropriate community services, and help free up GP time where patients present with non-medical issues.

Connect: Runs a range of networks and events to bring organisations together to learn from each other, encourage partnership working and build relationships. Funding events are an excellent example of this, providing an opportunity for groups to engage with local, regional and national funders and access information, advice and support.

Voice: Works in partnership with agencies from the third, statutory and private sectors and supports the Cumbria Third Sector Network, which includes Churches Together.
