A Brief Guide to Our History



First Church

New Jersey's first Catholic church, dedicated to St. John the Baptist, was built in 1814 at Market and Lamberton Streets in Trenton. A simple brick building 30 feet wide by 50 feet deep, St. John's drew a congregation of 30 families from both sides of the river, who continued to depend on visiting Philadelphia priests until 1830, when a resident pastor was appointed.


Second Church

Fourteen years later, Irish immigrants fleeing the potato famine had begun to swell the ranks of a congregation of German, French and Irish origin. The cornerstone for a new, much larger St.

John's was laid that year at Broad and Centre Streets. Completed in 1848, the new church was classical in design, built of stuccoed brick with a three-story bell tower. So rapid was the growth of the parish that a wing was added in 1856. Then, on Sunday night, September 30, 1883, fire destroyed the church, leaving only the exterior walls, belfry and cupola standing.

Third Church

A year after the fire, on August 3rd, 1884, the cornerstone for a new church was laid. On June 12th, the following year, the old St. John's bell, the one survivor of the fire, rang out again to signal the partial completion of the new church. Mass was celebrated for the first time in the basement chapel, designed to seat 1,300, although the pews hadn't arrived and parishioners stood or knelt. Long after the June 30th, 1889 dedication of the new Sacred Heart Church, it was the custom to celebrate only Sunday Masses in the church, while daily Mass continued in the basement chapel.
