CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: Throughout these days of Lent, we have solemnly and reflectively followed Jesus’ mission for the salvation of the world. Tonight, as we confront the culmination of Jesus’ Passion, we are compelled to face the harsh reality of our sin and the brokenness that it brings.

People: **Lord God, we need Your grace. We need Your forgiveness. We have failed to follow Your will. We have refused to obey Your law. We are unable to fulfill Your plan. We are crushed under the weight of our sin, and tonight the harsh reality of sin’s horror hangs heavy around us. It is sin that made the cross necessary. It is our sin that required the Savior’s death. Lord, we need Your grace. We need Your forgiveness.**

Pastor: We need a Savior. It was sin that made the cross necessary, but it was love that drove Jesus to the cross and held Him there. It was love for you. Because of His love and His perfect sacrifice, your sins have been covered. The debt has been paid. The burden has been removed. As you hear and experience that reality tonight, you know throughout that you have God’s grace. You have God’s forgiveness in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

✠ SERVICE OF DARKNESS ✠

THE FIRST WORD *Luke 23:32–34a* (“Father, forgive them . . .”)

Lector: O Lord, have mercy on us.

People: Thanks be to God.

PRAYER

Pastor: Lord Jesus Christ, You are the Prince of Peace. When You were mocked, You did not respond with harsh words. When You were tormented, You did not react in anger. When You were nailed to the cross, You prayed for the forgiveness of those who caused You to suffer. Give to us the virtues of gentleness, patience, and a forgiving spirit. Teach us also to love our enemies, and as children of the heavenly Father, to live in Your peace.

Lector: O Lord, have mercy on us.

PRAYER

Pastor: Lord Jesus Christ, in Your infinite mercy, You heard the plea of the dying thief on the cross next to You. We pray that You would open our hearts to welcome those who turn to You, and rejoice in their salvation. When our last hour comes, hold us firm in our faith, and bring us also to live with You in paradise.

("Here is your son . . . here is your mother.")

Lector: O Lord, have mercy on us.

People: Thanks be to God.

PRAYER

Pastor: Lord Jesus Christ, while You suffered the agony of the cross, Your thoughts turned to the welfare of others. Your concern was for Your mother in her sorrow. We pray that You would regard with pity all parents who mourn the death of their children, and all parents who sorrow because their children have gotten into trouble or forsaken their faith. By the power of Your healing, we pray that parents and children know peace and that relationships be restored.

("My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?")

Lector: O Lord, have mercy on us.

People: Thanks be to God.

PRAYER

Pastor: Lord God, Father of all people and Creator of all that exists, You hold all people in Your power. We pray that You would not forsake the world that Your Son died to redeem. Even though we still see the influence of sin and evil all around us, assure us of Your continued presence in our midst. Help us to know Your love in our lives, so we can show Your presence to others.
