MINISTER'S MUSINGS

By now many of you have probably heard about our twenty-seven year-old granddaughter's life-threatening bout with pneumonia. It was certainly a scary time for our family. And I am happy to say that she seems to be on the road to recovery. Although at this writing she is still in the Intensive Care Unit at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, she is off the respirator and breathing on her own again – a true blessing.

This experience has made me very aware of a number of things that many of us may take for granted in our lives. One of those things is the importance of family, whether biological or otherwise. As soon as we received the call from our daughter about her daughter's condition, a network of family connections was formed to offer physical, emotional, and spiritual support to our daughter as she lived with the reality of her child's tenuous hold on life. So I am very grateful for family, including my wonderful husband.

In addition, I have recognized the importance of friends when we are in grave circumstances. If Samantha's long-time friend had not come to her apartment when she could not reach her by phone and taken her immediately to the hospital, our granddaughter would not be alive today. In addition, we have all been bolstered by the support of friends and colleagues who shared e-mails and texts and calls with us in our time of despair. So I am grateful for friends.

And I am grateful for a religious and spiritual community like this one that gave me the support I needed to go to Maryland to be with our daughter and her daughter, covering many tasks that I was not here to perform. Thank you so much!

My hope is that we can all experience the blessings of family, friends, and a religious community in the good times and the difficult ones. I am convinced that these things, along with many others, can make all the difference. May it be so for all of you.



President App Vleingagger called the meeting to order at 7:02pm


President Ann Kleinsasser called the meeting to order at 7:03pm. The chalice was lighted and members checked in.






How Green Was My Valley
