The French have a way of distinguishing between a temporary separation from someone and a lasting one. The phrase "au revoir" is rather casual and simply means "until we meet again." In contrast, the word "adieu," seldom used today, suggests what the speaker believes will be a long, or even permanent, break. And there are even theological implications for these two kinds of expressions. Let's make this Sunday an example of positive leave-taking - and a Happy Father's Day too!

"Jimmy Carter For Women" Ann Kleinsasser, Lay Leader

This Sunday we examine our local clergy's responses to former President Jimmy Carter's decision to sever ties with his Southern Baptist faith over women's rights. Carter writes, "This discrimination, unjustifiably attributed to a Higher Authority, has provided a reason or excuse for the deprivation of women's equal rights across the world... Women are prevented from playing a full and equal role in many faiths. Nor, tragically, does [it] stop at the walls of the church, mosque, synagogue or temple."


