

Nova Scotia Landowner and Forest Fibre Producers Association Emergency Response Procedures

Accidental Spill of Flammable Liquid or Oil

- 1/ **Evaluate the Hazards** : Health and safety of workers
 - : The environment, water courses , wildlife
 - : Fire hazard

- 2/ **Take Control** : Notify fellow workers and supervisor
 - : Identify resources needed

- 3/ **Take action** : As directed and/or within the limits of your ability and resources
 - : Contain the spill
 - : Prevent further spillage
 - : Prevent entry into water

- 4/ **Call for Help** : Have location and spill specific information at hand .
 - : Any spill that may contaminate drinking water should be reported
 - : All spills of over 100 litres flammable liquids or non-contaminated used oil must be reported to the Nova Scotia Department of Environment.

- 5/ **Clean up** spill and remove contaminated materials to a proper disposal site

- 6/ **Notify** Landowner and complete reports as necessary. Restock spill kit.
