


REEVES CATTLE CO., KENEDY TUDY CRUZ. TEAM CAPTAIN



(ALL EVENTS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

AFTERNOON EVENT SCHEDULE:

MUTTON BUSTIN'

Begins 4:00 pm.

- Participants (boys and girls) must be between the ages of 4-7 and weigh less than 55lbs.
- Event is open to the first 40 kids that register.
- Each rider has 6 seconds to ride and show off their skills.
- \$25 entry fee for each rider

DUMMY ROPIN'

Begins 4:30 pm.

- Contest will consist of three rounds for each of the three age brackets: 6 and under, 7-10 and 11-14.
- No line, contestants who catch all three will rope in the Sudden Death Finals for the Main Awards.
- A line will be marked and the Reach Contest will begin. We will go back one foot each round. If nobody catches in a round we will restart the round at that distance.
- In the 6 and under, three legal head catches; slick horns, half head and bell collar (neck), in the 7-10 and 11-4 slick horns only will count.
- As always, judges decision will be final no exceptions.
- \$15 entry fee for each roper

EVENING EVENT SCHEDULE: Rodeo performance will begin at 6:30 pm.

ANNOUNCER - BROUGHT TO YOU BY TEXAS TACK & RAGS GRAND ENTRY - BROUGHT TO YOU BY OTG SERVICES

WILD COW MILKING (WACK'EM & STACK'EM)

When a "momma cow" is unable to provide milk for her calf, the cowboy must step in and retrieve the milk for the hungry calf.

- All team members must be mounted and in the starting box until the flag drops.
- Time will start when the flag is dropped.
- Flag will drop when cow crosses the chalk line.
- · Cow must be caught with a legal head catch. No heeling.



- · Cow must be milked while standing.
- Milk bottle must be brought to the finish line and handed to the judge (Flagman).
- Milk must pour from the bottle.
- Finish line will be a box at mid arena.
- Time will stop when the milk runner crosses the finish line.

STEER DOCTORING (HARRELL PLUMBING)

This is how working ranch cowboys doctor an animal out in the pasture. Sorting an animal out of the herd, then roping the head and heels to doctor.

- · All team members must be mounted and in the starting box until flag drops and time starts.
- · Team will be given doctoring marker prior to beginning run.
- · Team must sort numbered animal from herd and drive back across designated line.
- · Only the team's numbered animal shall be across the designated line prior to roping.
- · When the team's numbered animal has been driven across designated line the animal may be roped.
- · Catch steer, do not "trip" or abuse.
- · Legal head catch only.
- Steer must be lying on its side prior to doctoring and all four feet must be visible & pointing in the same direction.
- · When steer is on his side, "vet" will place a mark between the steer's eyes.
- · Time will stop when steer has been marked, all ropes have been removed and all team members are mounted.
- · Failure to clear all ropes will result in a no time (no points).

CALF BRANDING (SANTEX TRUCK CENTER)

The cowboys always look forward to roundup when the newborn calves are vaccinated and branded for identification purposes.

- All team members must be mounted and in the starting box until the flag drops.
- Time will start when the flag is dropped.
- Flag will drop when calf crosses the chalk line.
- Calf must be caught with a legal head catch and thrown. Do not drag the calf. Heeling allowed.
- Brander may leave the "fire" (bucket) when the calf is caught.
- Bucket will be at mid arena, spectator side.
- · Calf must be on the ground and restrained by at least one contestant while branding.
- · Brander shall brand calf on left or right thigh.
- Brand must be returned to fire by the brander.
- Time will stop when brand is returned to the "fire".

CALF SCRAMBLE (M&M METALS)

Children 12 and under may participate.





DOUBLE MUGGING (HOLT CAT)

When rounding up strays, cowboys will sometimes use a method called double-mugging. The stray cattle are tracked down, roped, and tied down to keep them from running away, and then returned to the herd.

- All team members must be mounted and in the starting box until the flag drops.
- Time will start when the flag is dropped.
- Flag will drop when both steers cross the chalk line.
- Steers must be caught with a legal head catch and thrown. Heeling allowed.
- Team must tie any three legs on both steers; remove all other ropes on both steers.
- · Steers must remain tied until time stops.
- Time will stop when last steer is tied and all ropes are off.

STEER LOADING (HOLT CAT)

This team of working cowboys must work in unison to catch and load a wild steer from the pasture.

- All team members must be mounted and in the starting box until the flag drops.
- Time will start when the flag is dropped.
- Flag will drop when steer crosses the chalk line.
- Steer must be caught with a legal head catch. Heeling allowed.
- Trailer will be centered in the arena.
- Steer must be loaded, gate closed and latched.
- Time will stop when the trailer gate is latched.

MUTTON BUSTIN' FINALS

Top 8 contestants from afternoon performance will compete.

HIDE RACE (SANTEX TRUCK CENTER)

When the work is done, there is always enough energy for a little horseplay.

- Three man event, with two teams competing head to head.
- Horse and hide must be behind starting line until the flag drops.
- Time will start when the flag is dropped.
- Hide rope must be dallied above upper mark on rope (15' from hide).
- Rider must grab rope at or near hide knot.
- First rider must ride the hide from start/finish line to return line (or barrel).
- Second rider must ride the hide from return line (or barrel) to start/finish line.
- Riders may not advance on foot.
- If a rider falls, the hide must be returned to the rider.
- Time will stop when the hide rider crosses finish line.







SOME GROUND RULES:

A TEAM CONSISTS OF FIVE CONTESTANTS. A team may start the rodeo with less than five contestants, but no concessions will be made.

PROPER WESTERN ATTIRE MUST BE WORN, including hat, long sleeve shirt, jeans, boots and chaps.

CONTESTANTS SHOULD OBSERVE GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP. No loud or persistent profanity and no inhumane treatment of animals. Any participant found to be conducting himself in an unsportsmanlike or inappropriate manner will be disqualified.

ANY UNNECESSARY ABUSE OF LIVESTOCK WILL RESULT IN A TEAM DISQUALIFICATION, at the discretion of the Flagman and Arena Director.

A TIME LIMIT OF THREE MINUTES will be allowed in each event. Any event not completed in three minutes will result in a no-time (no points) for that event.

DECISIONS MADE BY THE FLAGMAN ARE FINAL. A re-run in the event of unsatisfactory animal performance is at the discretion of the Arena Director.

IF A CONTESTANT CROSSES THE START LINE BEFORE THE FLAG IS DROPPED, a 10 second penalty will be assessed.

A LEGAL HEAD CATCH is a horn catch, half-head or neck. Heeling is permitted in any roping event except the cow milking. Heeling will only be allowed after a legal head catch.

THE ORDER OF COMPETITION WILL BE DETERMINED BY DRAWING. The first event will start with the first drawn team. The second event will start with the second drawn team and the first team will be last. That rotation will continue as necessary.

THE WINNING TEAM WILL BE DECIDED BY TOTAL POINTS. Teams in each event will receive points towards their overall score. In any given event (with a minimum of six teams), the points are as follows: 1st = 6 pts 2nd = 5 pts 3rd = 4 pts 4th = 3 pts 5th = 2 pts 6th = 1 pt. In the event of a tie, the team with the lowest overall time will be the winner. If one of the tied (on points) teams has more qualified runs than the other, the team with the most qualified runs will be the winner.

ROPE RULE. A loose horse with a loose rope will result in a no-time (no points) for that event.

HISTORY OF THE SAN ANTONIO CORRAL CLUB

The San Antonio Corral Club was established in the fall of 1995. It began with a small ambition of raising funds with friends through parties and concerts. The funds raised were to be used to purchase livestock at the Junior Livestock Auction held during the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo. The word went out and the first meeting was called at Alamo Café. Much to everyone's surprise, a large and enthusiastic crowd attended. The first Corral Club concert was underway featuring a rising star by the name of Robert Earl Keen, Jr. The concert was a great success and we were off to the auction with money for the kids.

In January of 2013, the Bar-B-Que Cook-off and Concert set a record with the number of team entries as the largest in Texas and second largest in the United States. This September will mark the 19th Annual Cook-off. Hopes are high for another record breaking year, as we enjoy our long awaited return home to the grounds of the AT&T Center.

While the Cook-off is managed under the name of the Bar-B-Que Committee, our organization still believes in its grass roots. The Ring of Fire Ranch Rodeo and Concert has become the Corral Club's way of continuing to directly support the Junior Livestock Auction. With twelve ranch rodeos under our belt, the Corral Club has been able to make record contributions to the auction exceeding \$450,000 cumulatively. In February of this year, over 140 kids were assisted by our organization. These figures make our organization extremely proud, considering our humble beginnings.

However, what makes us continue to grow the event are the thank you letters we receive each year from the children of the auction. They are truly amazing and we appreciate the help we receive from our donors and sponsors each year. Thank you for helping all those amazing kids and we hope to see you next year.


