GRATEFUL DEAD: Dick's Picks Vol. 27—Oakland Coliseum Arena,

Oakland, CA 12/16/92 (3-CD Set) This is the only Dick's Picks volume to feature the final Dead line-up, with Vince Welnick assuming all keyboard duties after the departure of Bruce Hornsby, and, fittingly enough, it provides quite the showcase for the ex-Tubes keyboardist's vocal chops on the unexpected covers of the Who's "Baba O'Riley" and the Beatles' "Tomorrow Never Knows!" Those are two of the four bonus songs taken from the next night's show at the same venue; the rest of this 3-CD set presents the complete 12/16/92 Oakland show, which offers among

its treasures a rare (albeit abbreviated), '90s reading of "Dark Star," a great, Pigpen-tribute rendition of "Good Lovin'," Bob Weir's fine reading of Willie Dixon's "The Same Thing" and a marvelously exploratory "Playing in the Band/Drums/Space" segment. One of the best '90s Dead shows, presented in HDCD sound—never before available in stores!

GRATEFUL DEAD: Dick's Picks Vol. 28—2/26/73 Pershing Municipal Auditorium, Lincoln, NE 2/28/73 Salt Palace, Salt Lake City, UT (4-CD Set)

These two 1973 concerts take place about two weeks after the Dead added a large number of new, jazzy numbers to their repertoire, one of which ("Eyes of the World") plays a central role in both shows excerpted here (though these are not complete shows, only one song, "Deal," that was played either of these

nights does not appear here in at least in one version). As usual, it's the medleys that hold the most jaw-dropping feats of improvisational derring-do; the first night's "Dark Star/Eyes of the World/Mississippi Half-Step Uptown Toodeloo" is seamlessly sublime (or is that sublimely seamless?), while the second night's "Truckin'/The Other One/Eyes of the World/"Morning Dew" covers a prodigious amount of terrain, from raucous to frenzied to lilting to lyrical in the space of nearly one glorious hour. Also noted with pleasure is the appearance of "Box of Rain," which the Dead performed live sparingly. Presented in HDCD sound—never before available in stores!
