A Message from Pastor Fred

Dear Friends.

It is the month of March! "In like a lion. Out like a lamb" goes the old saying. I was reading an interesting article by a meteorologist about this saying. He did a study of the last ten years of March weather in the Milwaukee area, and in only one year was this actually the case! But, like Groundhog Day, it gives us an amusing way to look at the weather! Our son was born in March, while we were still in Chicago, and it seemed like the old month was a lion! We were buried in snowstorm after snowstorm! We lived on the south side of the city. The hospital were Sean was to be born was downtown - about a 40 minute drive when conditions were good! 
