

RECIPE OF THE MONTH FROSTED PUMPKIN BARS

BARS

2 cups sugar

2 cups flour

1 (15 1/2 oz) can pumpkin

1 cup oil

4 eggs

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

18 oz cream cheese softened

1 stick of butter softened

3 1/2 cups powdered sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

DIRECTIONS

Combine all bar ingredients: mix well. Pour into ungreased 15 1/2X 10 1/2 jelly roll pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool.

To make frosting, cream softened cream cheese and butter. Gradually add sugar; beat until well blended, add vanilla. Makes 4 dozen.
