Dear Friends -

Many of you know that I grew up in Upstate New York in the Finger Lakes area. It is in the western part of the state and is a beautiful area of lakes and hills. Our home was outside of Geneva at what was then a lot of farm area. My brother and I would love to go exploring in all these open fields and just see where it took us. One day however we realized we had gone farther than we had ever gone before and we were not exactly sure how to get back home! It was a little bit terrifying for us! We were probably nine or ten years old at the time. We kept walking and eventually saw a house! We stopped there and introduced ourselves as two vey lost boys and asked if we could call our home. They said yes and mom and dad came to get us. They were of course a bit upset that we had strayed too far - but all of us were glad just to be together again - safely! IT was a life lesson learned!

When have you felt lost? When have you felt you strayed too far from home? How do you find your way back? I believe all of us have times when we feel "lost". We are not sure of how to solve a family problem. Or we are not sure if we should change jobs. Or we are not sure if we should undergo that surgery (I dealt with that question for a few months before deciding to go ahead with this latest back surgery!). Feeling lost is a human predicament that we all encounter at some time.

So what do you do to get back on the right road for your life? How do you decide which direction to take? Sometimes we even feel like we have strayed too far from God and are not sure how to get back. I encourage you to come back to church and be more regular in your worship and you will discover that God has been waiting to welcome you with open arms. I encourage you to begin a prayer life where you talk with God and tell Him what is on your mind and ask for His guidance. Even now in these warm summer days God is waiting for you to return to Him and trust in His wisdom. In that old song we sing "what a friend we have in Jesus - take it to the Lord in prayer". Let's act on what we sing! Another old song (Amazing Grace) reminds us that we once were lost but now are found! Let's believe in what we sing!

So I welcome you to worship. If you are feeling lost I pray that God will show you the way you should go. Thank you all for your commitment to our family of God gathered here at Jackson Park Lutheran Church. And thank you for your faithfulness to our God! Pastor Fred


