

Biographical of Michael J. Keegan (2012)

Michael has been a life-long resident of Monroe, Michigan. Michael's academic studies include the social sciences at Central Michigan University (CMU), Eastern Michigan University (EMU), University of Michigan (UM), and Bowling Green State University (BGSU). Michael holds degrees of BS, MA, and is ABD in Sociology.

For the past 30 years Michael has actively engaged in opposition to nuclear power and nuclear proliferation. He has testified in hearings at County, State, Provincial, U.S. Federal and Canadian Federal levels providing expert testimony on nuclear power. He has frequently been legal intervenor in matters before the U.S. and Canadian federal governments. Michael has helped stop Nuclear Waste Dumps, Nuclear Power Plants, Incinerators, Bomb Tests, Landfills, Radioactive Shipments on Great Lakes and many other nuclear ills. Currently Michael is engaged as a legal intervenor in the proposed Fermi 3 license application (COLA) and the Davis-Besse re-licensing (LRA).

Michael began with his opposition in 1980 to the Fermi 2, which is located near Monroe. In the mid 1990's he brought together the environmental group Citizen's Resistance at Fermi Two (CRAFT). He is currently Co-Chair of Don't Waste Michigan (DWM) and is Chair of the Coalition for a Nuclear-Free Great Lakes (CNFGL). Michael co-chairs a task force for Great Lakes United dedicated to Green Energy and Nuclear-Free. Michael serves as adviser to several bi-national environmental organizations on energy & nuclear power.

In addition Michael has been a Community Organizer of Food Banks, Assault Response Crisis Centers, Comprehensive Substance Abuse Services, and many other Environmental & Social Justice causes.

Michael has made his living as a Social Worker and Energy Consultant.
